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Accident Damages Sought In Two Suits Involving Deaths

Two damage suits have been filed in circuit court, the results of traffic accidents resulting in fatalities.

Agnes has been filed against William Ellison by Velma Bennett, the administratrix of the estate of Ramona Duquette, killed in an automobile accident in July 1954.

The complaint charges Ellison was negligent in driving and under the influence of liquor at the time. Mrs. Duquette, 22, and a companion, Charles Andrus, 20, both were killed when struck by Ellison's car as they were walking beside Highway 99 north of Oakland.

Ellison was charged with negligent homicide, but subsequently the charge was reduced to reckless driving and he was fined \$250 in circuit court.

Mrs. Duquette has two children surviving. Zeida Dickerson, executrix of the estate of Quintus R. Dickerson, has filed a suit for \$20,000 against Marvin D. and William H. Wallen as the result of the July 26, 1955, death of the deceased.

She is the wife of Dickerson, who was killed in a freak accident on a county road seven miles west of Sutherlin. According to the complaint, Dickerson was unhooking a trailer from a truck and was standing between them when a truck driven by Marvin and owned by William Wallen hit the trailer. Dickerson was allegedly crushed between the truck and trailer.

Mrs. Dickerson charges negligence, Dickerson, 44, was the father of two children.

Fire Damage Estimate At Canyonville Upped

A more complete estimate of the damage done in a Friday night fire at the Clyde McNeal home in Canyonville was pegged today at about \$12,000, according to correspondent Virginia Proctor.

The McNeals were renting the two-bedroom house from Glenn Gilmore, who estimated value of the house, which was totally destroyed, at \$6,000. It was insured.

Meanwhile, the McNeals estimated the loss of their uninsured furniture at \$6,000. The McNeals have been staying with Mrs. McNeal's parents, Mr. and Mrs. E. S. Redfield, in Glen Dale. But they will soon move into an apartment being held for them by Mrs. Earl Rodman in Canyonville.

Mrs. Proctor reports the McNeals were provided clothing, bedding and cooking utensils by neighbors. Now their only immediate need is household linen, Mrs. Proctor said.

Cause of the fire was still undetermined.
