St. Louis Budweisers Set National Keg Mark

ST. LOUIS (AP)—The Budweisers of St. Louis, who are after the National match game bowling championship, set two national season highs Wednesday night with a 3,729 three-game block and a second-game 1,263.

Little Dick Weber shot a perfect 300 game to lead off the first game, but he wasn't high man for the night and the Bud's first game 1,228 was the worst of the block. They hit 1,232 in the last game.

The Bud's 3,729, scored in a league match with another St. Louis team, was just 70 pins off the world record of 3,799, set in 1937 by the Hermann Undertakers of St. Louis.

It was 248 pins better than the season's previous high of 3,551 set by a Pittsburgh team.

The Buds lead the defending champion Strohs of Detroit by 965 pins at the halfway-point of their 24-game match for the title.

SOONERS QUIT

NORMAN, Okla. (AP)—Two starters on the University of Oklahoma basketball team have quit the squad and will withdraw from the school at the end of the present semester.

Jimmy Peck, a junior from Leedy, Okla., said "basketball has stopped being fun and I felt I wasn't helping the team or myself by staying at OU."

Sophomore Gary Balding of Hazelton, Kan., said he had worked hard under Coach Doyle Parrack, in his first year as Sooners' mentor, but added that Parrack has "lost my confidence."

When that happens, he added, "You don't help your team or yourself."

Three other members of the Oklahoma varsity quit the team earlier this month.

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National Football League Taps 360 Players; UCLA Gains 11 On College Draft List

LOS ANGELES (AP)—National Football League coaches and executives have tapped the college ranks for 360 players, most of them eligible for service next fall, and some for delivery in 1957.

The UCLA Bruins, who finished second in the Rose Bowl thriller to Michigan State, topped the colleges with 11 players drafted, but three of their top stars, fullback Bob Davenport, end R. M. L. Loudd, and fullback Doug Peters, have indicated a preference for the Canadian league.

The Cleveland Browns drafted Davenport, described by Coach Red Sanders as the best college

EUGENE (AP)—Jack Morris, University of Oregon sophomore back drafted by the Los Angeles Rams, has no thought of going into pro football before completing his two additional years at Oregon.

Although only a sophomore, he was eligible for the draft because his class—which he left to enter military service—graduates in June.

Dick James, senior and choice of the Washington Redskins, is interested in pro football but is vulnerable to military draft first because he dropped out of advanced officer training.

The basketball game between the Glide Town Team and the F & J Loggers scheduled for Wednesday night at Glide was called off.

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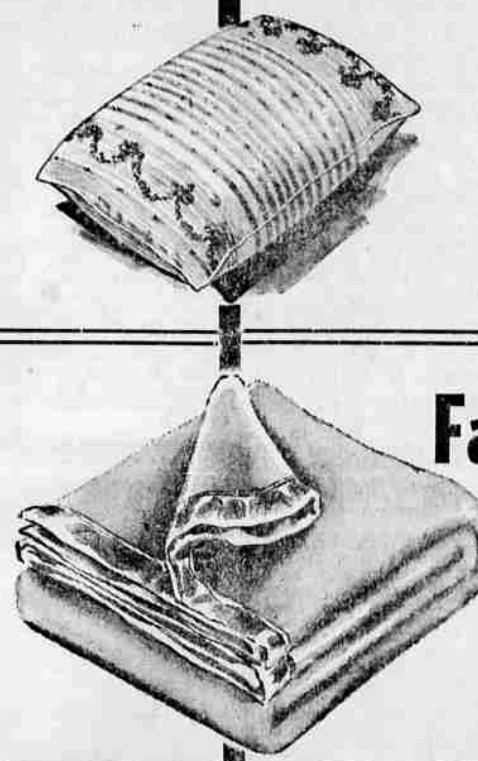
