Missionary Is Killed In Attack Of Shark

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. (AP) — Lester Burton, 33, of Grand Rapids, a missionary in Costa Rica for five years, was killed by a shark Monday in a river at the border of Nicaragua and Costa Rica.
His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Gordon L. Burton of Grand Rapids, were informed of his death by a relayed short wave radio message from authorities of the Latin American mission in San Jose.
Burton was driving from Grand Rapids to San Jose on the Pan American Highway after completing a nine-month furlough shortly before Christmas. He was delayed at the border Monday by customs authorities and decided to swim in a nearby river with his son, Charles, 14.
Upon entering the river, Burton was attacked by a shark that severed his right leg at the knee. He made his way to shore but died of loss of blood, the radio message said.
