War Supplies Haven't Changed East Picture

LONDON — The Eden government said Thursday under-cover shipments of British war surplus goods to the Middle East have not changed the military balance between Israel and her Arab neighbors.

A white paper, giving the results of a government investigation to Parliament, declared: "Between 50 and 100 old Sherman tanks without breech blocks which had been licensed for export to France have reached Israel and 151 old Valentine self-propelled mountings without breech blocks which had been licensed for export to Belgium have reached Egypt. "It can thus be fairly said that the surplus war material which is known to have found its way indirectly to Egypt and to Israel in the course of the last year has been not only relatively small in quantity but obsolete, ineffective and unreliable for war."

Labor Union Blacklisted By Chilean Government

SANTIAGO, Chile — Chile's million-member Central Labor Union (CLU) has been blacklisted by the government. Authorities termed the union "illegal" and charged it was "acting contrary to democratic government."

Instructions were sent to officials throughout the country Wednesday night telling them not to have any dealings with the CLU. Orders also were issued to reject CLU intervention in any labor dispute.

The CLU early this month called a nationwide strike in opposition to a government proposal to freeze wages and prices as an anti-inflation move. Taking action under a state of siege, the government broke the strike and arrested some 300 CLU members, including union chief Clotario Blest.

Interior Minister Benjamin Videla said the state of siege—a modified form of martial law—would continue until elements which threaten the government are overcome.

Field Marshal Arrives To Report On Cyprus

LONDON — Field Marshal Sir John Harding arrived in London Thursday with a bulging briefcase to report personally to Prime Minister Eden on moves to bring peace to the strife-ridden Cyprus. Harding, governor of that British military bastion in the eastern Mediterranean, flew overnight from Nicosia, the Cyprus capital. He told newsmen some progress had been made in narrowing the differences between the British and the Greek-speaking Cypriots on the island. But he cautioned that difficult and complex issues remained to be solved.

Broiling Chickens Leading Bargain Specials Parade

Chickens for broiling or frying will lead the hit parade of bargain specials in many of the nation's food stores and supermarkets this weekend.

Prices are down almost everywhere. In New York, one large food chain has trimmed retail prices of its pre-packaged, ready-to-cook fryers and broilers to their lowest level since 1954.

Lower prices are the rule in many cities, too, for sirloin steak, beef rib roast, pork and lamb. Boneless chuck pot roast, chuck steak, boneless cross rib roast and fresh pork shoulders also occupy a prominent spot on the weekend special list. Turkeys are featured in some areas.

Market analysts attribute low broiler prices to stepped-up production on poultry farms.

Grapefruit is in good supply in most markets, despite the Florida frost. Oranges and tangerines also offer excellent value.

Market specialists have tagged potatoes, onions, lettuce, collards and kale as outstanding buys in vegetables, with Canadian turnips, beets and sweet potatoes listed as "good" buys. Other featured produce items: Mackintosh apples, Cuban pineapples, Texas broccoli and new green cabbage.
