Market, VFW Teams Win In Twin-City Basketball

Sutherland City Drive-In Market and Oakland VFW moved to the top of the Twin-City League basketball standings with unbeaten marks after posting third straight wins Thursday night.

Oakland produced the top win, turning back the previously unbeaten F & J Loggers 94-47 on the Washington School gym floor in Oakland. Sutherland Drive-In posted a 67-51 decision over Hansen's Furniture.

Both games followed almost the same pattern with the winners breaking away in the closing minutes of play after a close game. Oakland led at all the quarter stops over F & J. Quarter scores were 17-16, 33-28 and 46-41. The lead changed hands several times during the game and until high point men Jerry Cade and Lyle Beecroft broke the game wide open in the closing five minutes it was close. Cade, high point man with 21, connected around the key and Beecroft rebounded as Oakland pulled away from a 49-42 score in the final five minutes. City Drive-In led 18-6, 24-22 and

45-34 at the quarter stops over Hansen's Furniture. Midway through the final period, high point men Bob Schneider and Earl Plummer connected from the outside regularly to break the furnituremen.

OTHERWISE, the biggest improvement was shown when Roseburg took two games without defeat (both over county teams: Reedsport and Myrtle Creek) to move from sixth to a tie for third spot. Myrtle Creek, with wins over Fiddle and Douglas, and despite its loss to Roseburg, held on to second behind Drain.

Drain Thursday night defeated Oakridge 68-55 in a district 5 A-2 makeup game. Reedsport was a 77-45 winner over Siuslaw last weekend. Two more intra-county games are slated tonight. Roseburg at Reedsport and Douglas at Sutherlin.
