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Hells Canyon Controversy Is Developing Into Major Political Issue In Oregon

WASHINGTON—The Hells Canyon controversy is fast ebbing as a major political issue in eastern Oregon, in the view of Rep. Sam Coon (R-Ore.), who says his constituents are finding that a bird in the hand is worth two in the bush.

From reports that have been coming to him from his home town of Baker, which is about 60 miles from the Hells Canyon area of the Snake River, Coon said he understands that long-time supporters of the high federal dam are coming around to the conviction that the Idaho Power Co. three-dam plan is all right after all.

The reason, prosperity.

"The merchants in Baker had the best Christmas season they've had in a long time," observed Congressman Coon. "All the apartment houses are filled up. Same way with the rooming houses."

What is true of economic conditions in Baker these days, Coon said is also true of the towns of Richland and Weiser, Idaho, which have felt the impact of construction workers' dollars on local cash registers.

Idaho Power Co. gained approval of a license to build three dams in the middle Snake River area this past year. Morrison-Knudsen Construction Co. in recent weeks moved \$20,000,000 worth of construction equipment into the area, Coon said, and crews began building barracks for workmen on a double-shift.

Potato Stocks Total Reported

WASHINGTON — The Agriculture Department reported Thursday that stocks of merchantable potatoes in storage on Jan. 1 totaled 127,100,000 bushels.

These stocks—in the hands of growers and dealers in or near producing areas—were described as "only moderately higher" than stocks on hand a year earlier after a bigger producing season.

Farm officials generally had expected the stocks to be somewhat larger than reported. They said the supply situation should provide a basis for probably more stable prices to growers.

The department said that up to Jan. 1, 1956, late crop potatoes had moved to market at a faster rate than in the fall of 1954. Sales prior to Jan. 1 this year from the 36 late and intermediate states were 8 per cent larger than sales up to Jan. 1 last year despite a production in 1955 that was only 5 per cent larger than the 1954 yield.

The department said potatoes from last year's crop to be marketed after Jan. 1 this year appeared to be only 4,300,000 bushels in excess of marketings after Jan. 1 last year.

Mothers Asked To Help Sons Entering Service

WASHINGTON — Carter L. Burgess, assistant secretary of defense for manpower, Thursday called upon mothers to help their sons understand and accept required military service.

"A mother needs to encourage her son to plan his life in harmony with existing realities which face him and his country—keeping clearly in mind the fact that if the free nations lose the present world struggle, none of us will be planning anything for a long time," Burgess said in remarks prepared for the Women's Forum on National Security.

Attending the forum are representatives of 13 national women's patriotic organizations and auxiliaries of veterans organizations.



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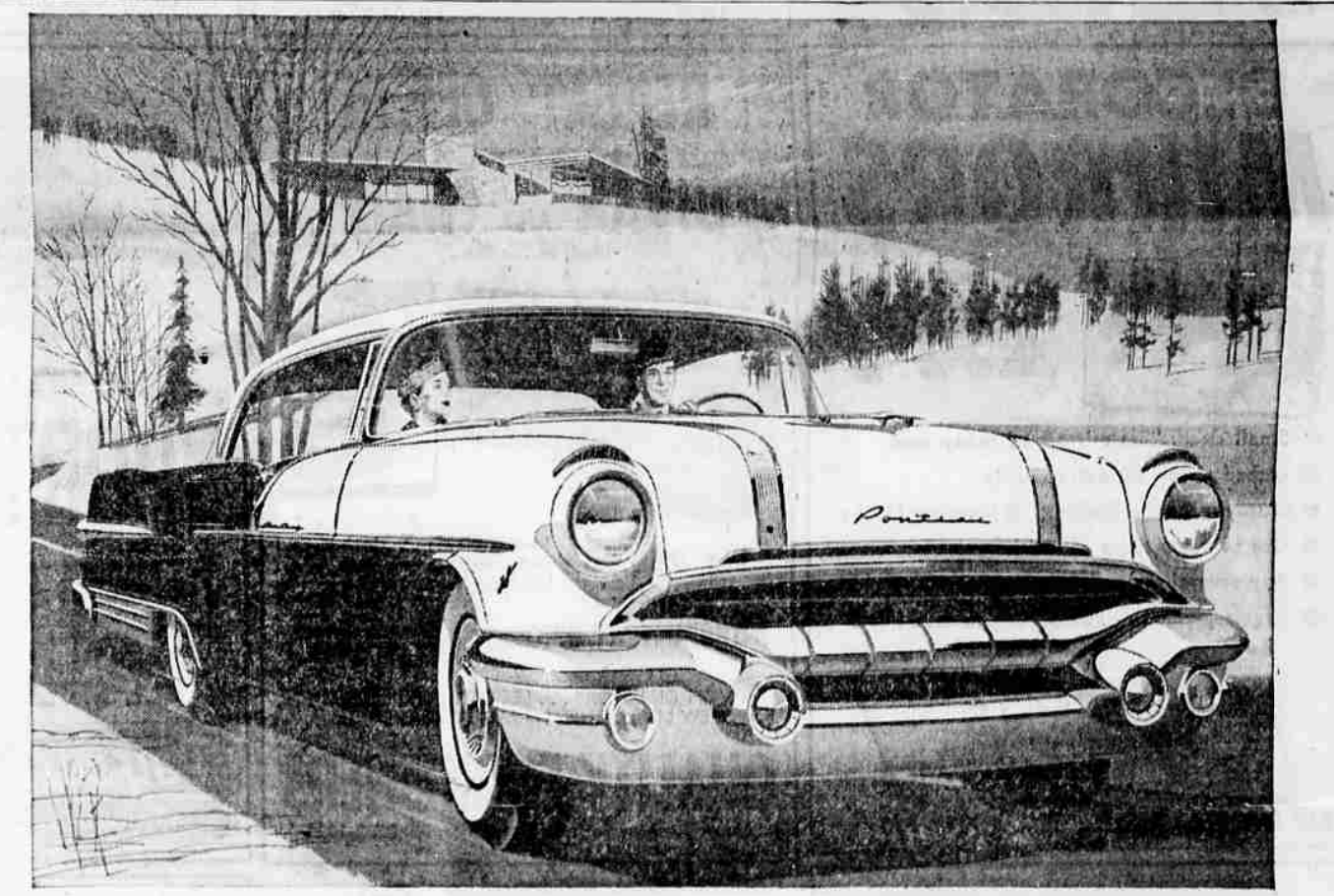
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
