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Lillie Moore Property Will Be Discussed At Special Council Session Jan. 30

What the Council did:

1. Scheduled a meeting Jan. 30 of the council - of the whole - to listen to requests from the Douglas County Historical Society about the Lillie Moore property, a report from the library committee of the council and petitioners for off-street parking. The council requested that all petitions be filed with the city before that meeting and that circulators of petitions appear at the meeting.

2. Heard the reading of a letter from Roseburg Civil Defense Director Dudley Walton commending the fire, police and city manager departments for expedient work in the recent floods. He also requested a meeting with the county civil defense agency to see if the facilities of the sheriff's communication system can be used to pick up more accurate up-river readings to allow easier evacuations in any future floods.

3. Heard a report from City Manager George Farrell on the city's efforts to secure the property declared surplus at the Veterans Administration Hospital. He said Rep. Harris Ellisworth was optimistic the property could be secured on the basis of two similar actions made by cities in other parts of the country.

4. Re-elected George Luoma president of the council.

5. Saw the presentation of the Mayor's Award to Roseburg Patrolman Gail Carline. (See story page 1.)

6. Tabled a request for business license for television and radio repair by C. L. Ward. He requests right to set up the shop at 632 NE Winchester.

7. Briefly discussed traffic and parking problems in the city center. The council voted to select a citizen's committee to study the problems and make recommendations. (See story page 1.)

8. Heard the first reading of an

ordinance to set collection of sewer service charges into action.

9. Reappointed Edward Murphy and Mrs. John Ruysan to the city's library board.

10. Held a public hearing as the result of completion of the Court Street sanitary sewer. Bail, Harrison Street and Terrace Avenue paving. No objections were made, and council formally accepted the completed projects. The council referred the matter to the street committee to determine assessments to be made against property owners on the streets.

11. Heard annual "state of the city" reports from Farrell and Mayor Ernest Barker Jr. (See other story.)

Pals Of Portland Bank Burglary Suspect Taken

PORTLAND (AP) — Two men, identified by the FBI as associates of bank burglary suspect Theodore "Blackie" Audett, were arrested early Monday.

They are Charles Junior Emery, 32, and William Pacelli, 33, both of Portland, who police said were prowling a tavern.

Emery was caught near the tavern and Pacelli surrendered after police fired a shot in a chase from the rear of the tavern. Audett, taken into custody last week on a warrant charging him with burglary of a Cottonwood, Idaho, bank, is to have a hearing Tuesday. Bonds from another bank were found in his possession.

A charge of contributing to the delinquency of a minor placed against Walter Gibson, 22, Riddle has been dropped on motion of the district attorney. Gibson had been accused of keeping a 14-year-old girl away from her home all night.

Rev. George Knox Named Minister Of Westside Church

The Rev. George M. Knox is the new minister at the Westside Christian Church. He will assume his pastoral duties on Feb. 5.

A 1951 graduate of Northwest Christian College, Eugene, he now is studying at Phillips University, Enid, Okla., where he earned his master's degree in theology, and is holding a pastorate at Ceres, Okla.

The Rev. Mr. Knox formerly served as assistant pastor at the First Christian Church, Portland, and was youth director while there. He also was minister at Sisters.

The new minister is married, and he and his wife have two small children.

The Rev. Arlo Bristow, Eugene, has been serving as interim minister the past four months. The former pastor, the Rev. Harry Chapin, is in church work in Sheridan, Wyo.

The Rev. Mr. Knox was active in athletics at NCC and was given a special honor for sportsmanship in 1949. He had a "very fine record" in academic work, according to Ross J. Griffith, president of the college. In 1951, the Rev. Mr. Knox was winner of a preaching contest conducted during the Oregon Preachers Parliament.

The Knoxes are due to arrive in Roseburg on Jan. 31.

The school was sponsored by the OSC Dept. of Civil Engineering to bring building inspectors abreast of latest developments in construction methods and practices.

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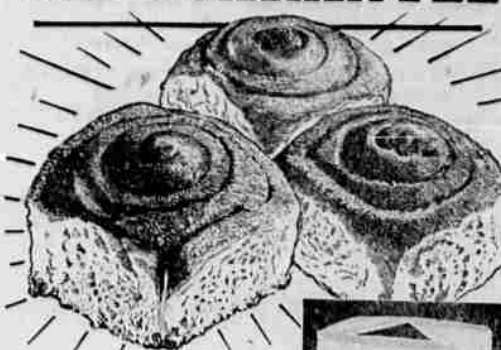
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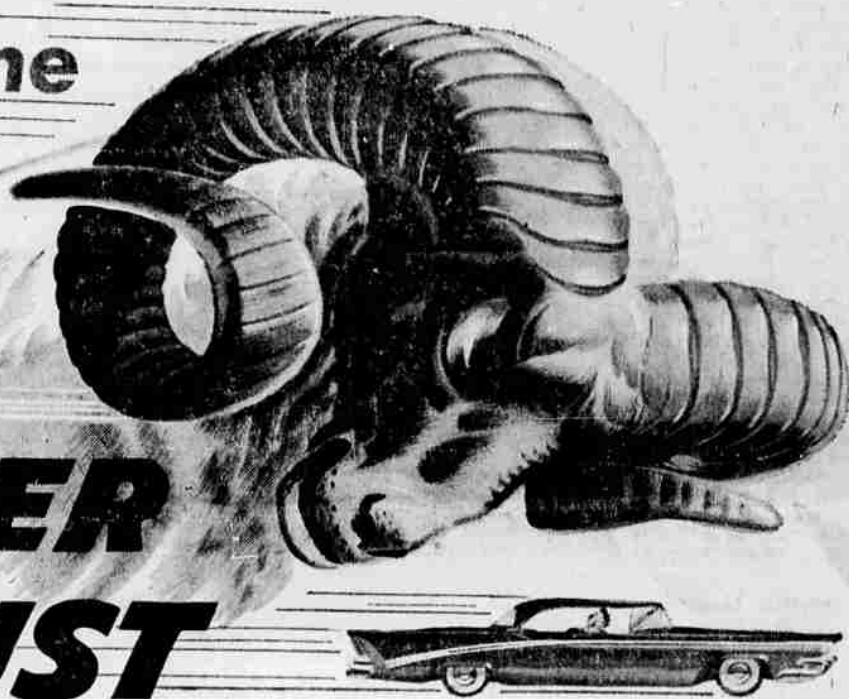
