Roseburg Folks' Kin, Freed From China, In Japan

Mr. and Mrs. Howard L. Ricks of Roseburg, Wis., uncle and aunt of Mrs. M. R. Mills and Mrs. Ruth Hoffman of Roseburg, are still in Tokyo, Japan, visiting a son prior to their return to this country.

Mr. and Mrs. Ricks were in the news last fall when they were repatriated from Red China after five years detention.

In an interview at the time of arrival in Japan from Hong Kong, Ricks said: "There is a gradual process of strangulation in effect against all private business" in Red China.

Ricks, who first applied for an exit visa in 1950, said he was told that when he had completed his company's affairs he could leave Shanghai.

He feels the Geneva negotiations helped accomplish the release of the couple. He sees a grim future for China. He explained that the average Chinese "appears to have no hard feelings toward America or Americans, but the official party line constantly tells the Chinese people that America is responsible for all the world's disorders over the last 10 years."

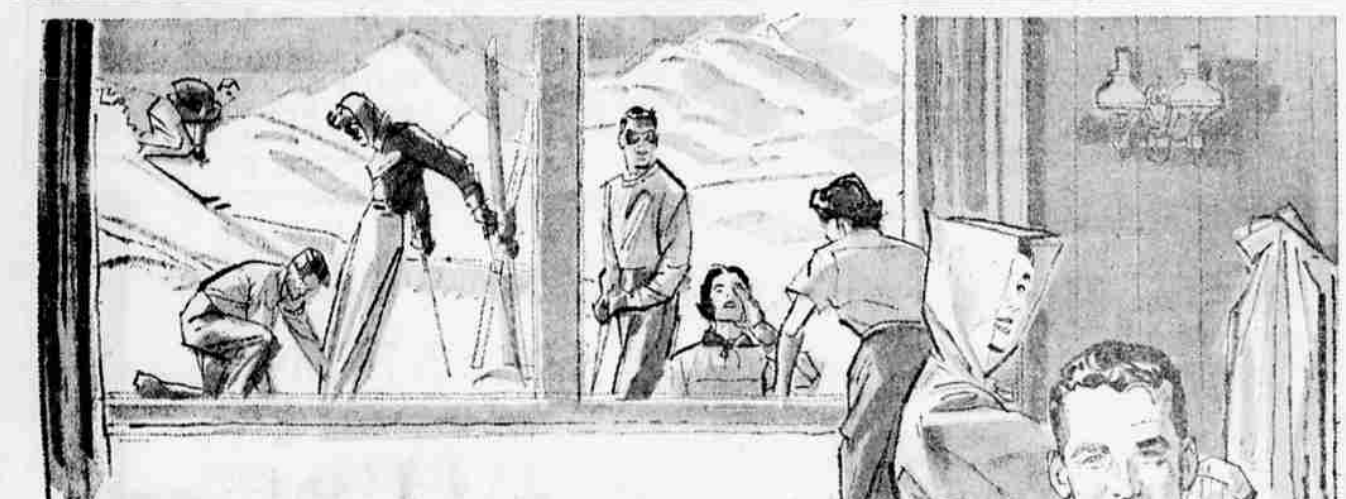
In recent years, Ricks was a director for an automobile distributorship. The couple first went to China in 1914. They were repatriated from China at the beginning of World War II, then returned to that country in 1947.
