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Huge Turboprop Plane Unveiled By Douglas Co.
LONG BEACH, Calif. (AP)—A huge turboprop transport plane, with twice the capacity of any now in service and a tail as high as a four-story building, has been unveiled by Douglas Aircraft Co. The four-engine C124A was rolled out of a hangar at the Douglas plant last week. It will be flown for the first time next spring. With a 90-foot long cabin floor, the plane can carry more than 200 troops or any of various combinations of military equipment. The payload is twice that of the C124 Globemaster, largest transport now in service.

6,000 FOR DRAFT
WASHINGTON (AP)—Six thousand men will be drafted in April for service in the Army. The Defense Department's monthly draft call, issued Friday, showed the same Army quota for April as for March. There was no mention of the Navy, which was allotted 10,000 men under the call for March.

Satellite Might Be Used For Reconnaissance Against Enemy Nations' Build-ups

NEW YORK (AP)—Joseph and Stewart Alsop reported in The New York Herald Tribune that concentrated work has started on a project looking toward launching a reconnaissance satellite vehicle from this country within five years. The Alsops said in a copyrighted Washington story the project has been informally dubbed with rather grim humor—"Project Big Brother."

The story said the project is "wholly distinct" from the project for "a tiny earth satellite" announced by President Eisenhower. The Alsops said the latter project "far more modest and militarily meaningless."

The dispatch described the new project as "an enormous strategic significance." Among features of "Project Big Brother" reported by the Alsops were:

The satellite, as now envisioned, would be capable of transmitting to the United States images of the entire land area of the earth, including the now hidden area of the Communist countries. It is believed the images will be clear and detailed enough to register air base construction, fleet movements and other major military activity. The satellite would give a sure "fix" on existing Communist bases, which present methods cannot locate with absolute certainty. Launching a satellite vehicle able to watch the whole world—like the "Big Brother" of George Orwell's novel—shapes up as so difficult and expensive that the project may take longer than five years. The project, however, is "an absolutely serious one" and is already

Committee Asks Drug Traffic K.O.

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Cabinet committee says the underworld is finding the drug traffic "increasingly hazardous . . . though still supposedly profitable." To help stamp out the traffic and the crime it breeds, the committee recommended a series of actions, including stiffer prison sentences, more federal narcotics agents and increased control over manufacturing of drugs.

The committee also approved \$30 million dollars for payment this year to start a longer term conservation reserve that would apply to any crop land converted to grass trees, farm ponds or game refuges. This could operate for 10 years. Also approved in the omnibus measure was a special 250-million-dollar fund to be used in bolstering prices in pork, beef and other perishable farm products not eligible under regular price support programs. This would be in addition to several million dollars of customs receipts which can be used for similar purposes.

School Aid Bid Barrier Awaiting Ike's Action

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Rep Adam Clayton Powell Jr. (D-N.Y.) says he has offered conditionally to withdraw from a federal school aid bill his amendment which would bar federal funds to states practicing classroom racial segregation. He said he had messaged President Eisenhower that he would withdraw the amendment if the President would enforce the Supreme Court's ruling that racial segregation is unconstitutional.

Powell, a Negro congressman from Harlem, asked, "How can you morally or legally take federal funds and spend them for people who are disloyal to the basic precepts of our government?" Powell's controversial amendment faces probable filibuster in the Senate and could mean the death of the entire school aid program.

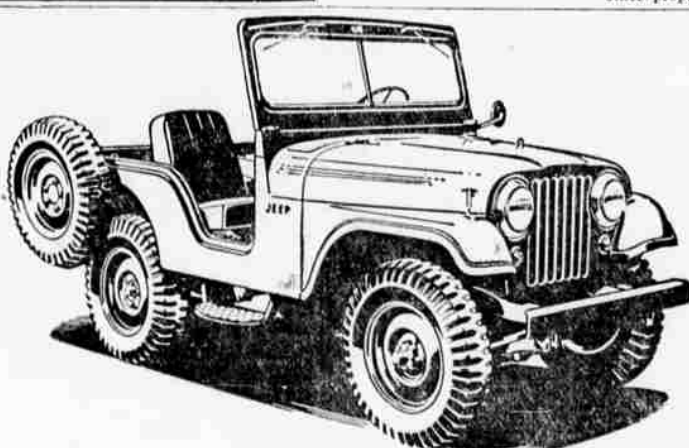
Carmen Miranda's Home To Be Sold By Estate

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP)—Sale of the late Carmen Miranda's home for \$61,500 has been approved in Superior Court to facilitate distribution of her estate estimated at more than \$100,000. Judge Harold W. Schweitzer approved the purchase by film musical director Bronislaw Kaper on a petition presented by the actress' husband, producer David A. Sebastian. Miss Miranda died last Aug. 5, leaving no will. Sebastian said the present estate estimate does not include oil leases and possible other property in Brazil.
