The program was concluded by the showing of the National Woman's Christian Temperance Union film, "Ceiling Unlimited."

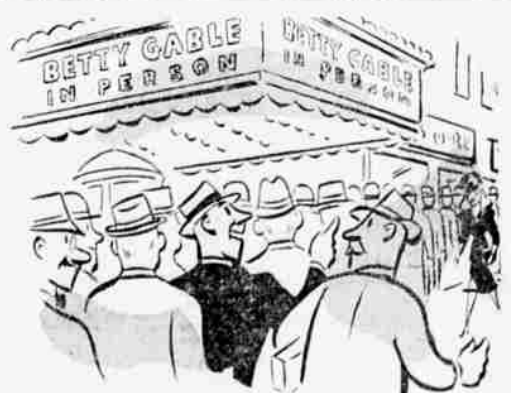

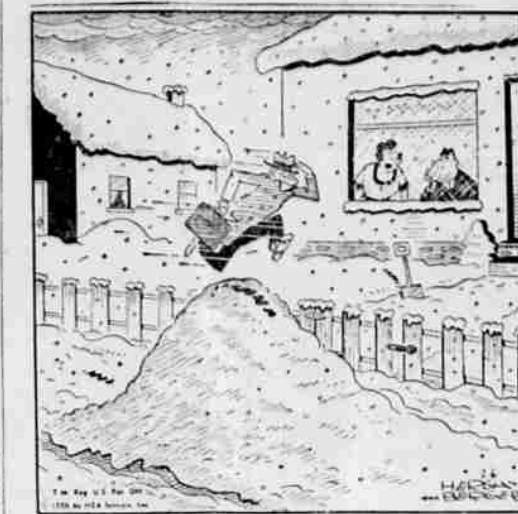
