Beta Cup Ski Race
Scheduled Feb. 12

SEATTLE — More than two dozen four-man teams are expected to compete Feb. 12 in the Beta Cup ski race on Stevens Pass, an annual giant slalom event for high school athletes.

Bellevue, Wash., High School will send a team to defend the cup and Little Mickey Johnson of Crowe High School, Trail, B.C., will return to defend the individual Hull Memorial trophy he won last year. For the first time the race will be sanctioned by the Pacific Northwest Ski Assn. and entries will be eligible for PSNA points. The three fastest times of each team will be counted in the cup competition.

Harvey Barragar, in charge of events, said the deadline for entering is Feb. 8.

Pettit, Arizin All Alone In Pro Scoring Race

NEW YORK — Bob Pettit of St. Louis and Paul Arizin of Philadelphia have the scoring race all to themselves at the moment in the National Basketball Assn., but there's no lack of action.

Pettit regained the lead (the 20th shift in 12 weeks) from Arizin's four-day hold with a 70-point two-game weekend that gave him a 6-point edge. Pettit, who has averaged 30.6 points a game in the last eight, has 1,148. Arizin has 1,142.

Pettit still is tops in game averages with a 24.4 mark for the season.

Woolpert Thinks Two Stars All-Americans

SAN FRANCISCO — The coach of the nation's No. 1 college basketball team thinks his varsity includes two All-American players.

Bill Russell, 6-10 center, and K. C. (Casey) Jones, 6-2 guard, are the men Coach Phil Woolpert credits for the University of San Francisco's court success the past two seasons.

Russell, an All-American a year ago as USC rolled to the NCAA title, figures as an almost cinch repeater. And Jones, in the words of Woolpert, has been "absolutely phenomenal" in the Dons' long victory drive.

"If All-American recognition means anything, and I guess it does, I don't know how anyone could possibly deserve that recognition more than Casey does," Woolpert said Monday at a basketball writers' luncheon.

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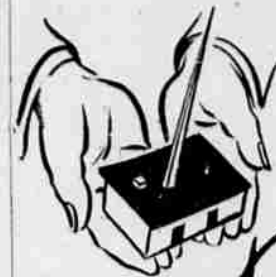

Optometrist Claims Red Hat Dangerous

SACRAMENTO, Calif. — Deer hunters who wear red caps and red coats to keep from being shot at may actually be inviting danger, says a Sacramento optometrist.

Dr. William A. Mayer Jr., reported Monday that research at the University of California School of Optometry showed 5 per cent of male hunters are red-green color blind. Therefore red clothes, to them, are indistinguishable from the green brush.

Dr. Mayer said vision specialists recommend a golden yellow color be used on the hunting clothes. "It may look white to color blind persons," he said, "but at least, the white would be distinguishable and not blend into the hunting terrain."

Paper Predicts Cassill Soon To Be Dismissed

SPOKANE — University of Washington alumni here are predicting an early exit for Harvey Cassill, UW athletic director. The Spokesman-Review said Tuesday. The newspaper said the alumni expect Cassill to be dismissed "within 24 hours."

Source of the information is the same Seattle outlet that knew 36 hours in advance that Johnny Cherberg would be fired as football coach. The Spokesman-Review said.

Cassill has been under fire for dismissing Cherberg after the coach had been rehired by the university's Board of Regents. Petitions calling for his ouster have circulated throughout the state.

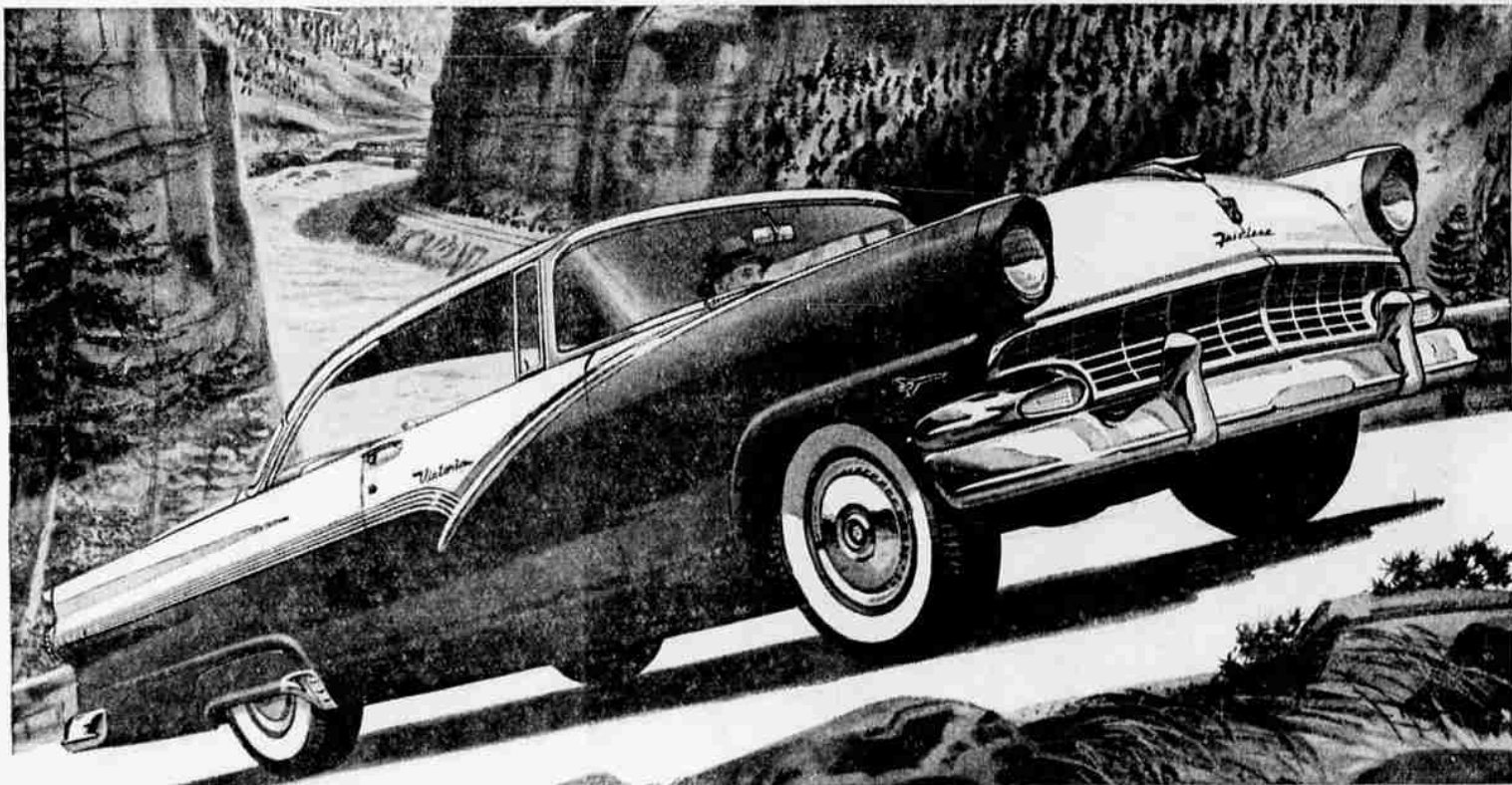
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
