Hungary Rejects U. S. Note Of Accusation

VIENNA, Austria — Hungary's Foreign Minister has rejected a U.S. note accusing the Communist government of persecuting its nationals employed by the U.S. legation and curtailing freedom of the press.

Radio Budapest said the Hungarian ambassador in Washington had been instructed to return the note, which was handed to him Friday.

"The note contains insulting and slanderous remarks... in connection with the sentencing of Hungarian citizens," Radio Budapest said. The reference was to verdicts for alleged espionage against Andre Marton, Associated Press correspondent in Budapest, and his wife, Iona, who worked for United Press.

The U.S. note said the United States is reconstituting a travel ban on U.S. citizens in Hungary.
