International Fisheries Hearing Has Been Ordered

SEATTLE — The Washington State Fisheries Department has been ordered to open talks with Oregon and California fisheries officials in a move to set up an international commission to control king and silver salmon fishing on the West Coast, Gov. Langlie said here.

Langlie told the Washington Trappers Assn. after the ground-work is laid the proposal will be presented to British Columbia and Alaska.

Any agreement reached would be subject to approval by the federal government, Langlie said.

He said a proposed international commission for king and silver salmon fishing probably would be modeled after the International Commission and the International Halibut Commission. The former commission controls the Frazar River sockeye industry and the latter watches over halibut fishing off the Pacific Northwest Coast.

Langlie defended a State Fisheries Department order delaying opening of the offshore trolling season for silver salmon from March 15 to April 15. Trollers protested the order keeps them from fishing but does not protect the salmon from Canadian fishermen.

Langlie said the curtailment will stand this year but trollers will be given a full review with public hearings before the 1957 season is set.

He told the fishermen the season originally was scheduled to close Sept. 30 but largely through their protests it was extended through Oct. 31 as in past years.

Surprise Alert Held For Pentagon Personnel

WASHINGTON — A surprise alert called by Secretary of Defense Wilson Tuesday sent about 400 lesser officials from the Pentagon to the secret hideouts where top officials would go in an enemy attack.

The stand-ins for the Pentagon's senior officials and officers left by helicopter, motor car and other conveyances just as their bosses would do if it were the real thing. No sirens were sounded and few of the Pentagon's 28,000 workers knew that anything unusual was afoot.

The test was designed to see that evacuation and orderly operation plans run smoothly.

DA Would Keep Indictments On Hugh D'Autremont

MEDFORD — Legal papers opposing dismissal of murder indictments against Hugh D'Autremont were filed in circuit court here Tuesday.

Dist. Atty. Walter Nunley wants the three murder indictments and two robbery indictments against the train robber to remain on file so they could be served against him should he ever be freed.

D'Autremont, then 17, and his older twin brothers, Ray and Roy, are serving life sentences in the Oregon State Penitentiary for the 1923 bombing and attempted mail robbery of a Southern Pacific train. Ray is a patient in the state mental hospital.

Edward C. Kelly, Hugh's attorney, filed the motion asking dismissal of the remaining indictments late in December. Nunley's memorandum was a reply to this motion.

The motion and memorandum are to be considered later by Judge H. K. Hanna.

Kelly bases his motion for dismissal on the ground that Hugh's constitutional rights have been violated because he was not given a speedy trial after being indicted.

Three persons were killed in the train robbery attempt near a Southern Pacific tunnel in Jackson County 33 years ago.

Earl Dickson Files His Candidacy For Governor

SALEM — Earl L. Dickson, Albany food market operator, filed his candidacy Tuesday for the Republican nomination for governor.

He is the first Republican to enter the race, although Gov. Elmo Smith and Rep. Walter Norblad, Stayton, said they are thinking about it.

Dickson's ballot slogan will be: "As a 'whipped Republican' if it be at all allowed."

His platform includes a statement that he would "strive for a better understanding of law, taxes and undelayed justice."
