 Jim Prevor of Grants Pass, formerly of Glendale, underwent further surgery at the Veterans Hospital in Portland recently.

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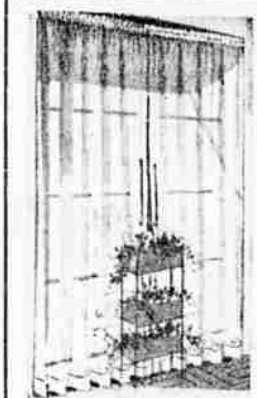
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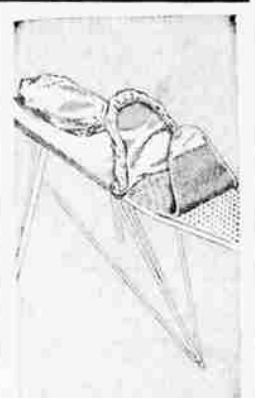
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
