Elmo Smith Appointed To National Committee

SALEM — Gov. Elmo Smith has been appointed here to the nine-member highway committee of the National Governors' Conference.

Smith, who succeeds the late Gov. Patterson on the committee, was appointed by Gov. Arthur B. Langlie of Washington, chairman of the Governors' Conference.

Gov. Smith has been chairman of the Oregon state Senate's Highway Committee in 1949 and 1951, in which he played an important role in obtaining passage of the state's 72 million dollar highway bond construction program.

He also is a member of the highway policy committee for the 11 Western states.

Smith is the only Western governor on the national committee.

While on this committee, Patterson worked for the new federal highway program that now is before Congress.

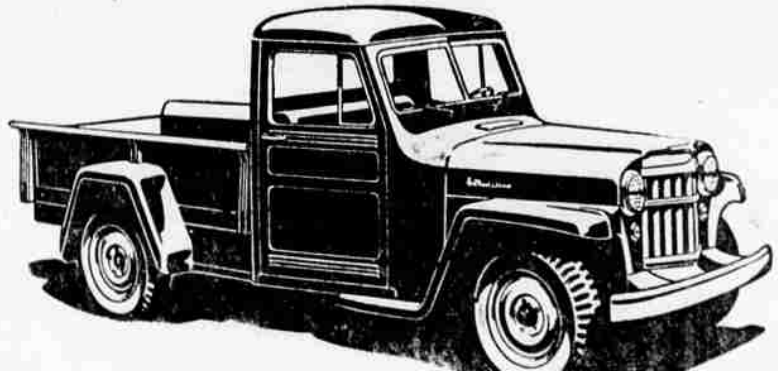
