

Fathers, 26-Year-Old Men Now Virtually Out Of Draft Unless Conditions Warrant

WASHINGTON — President Eisenhower has put fathers and men past their 26th birthdays practically out of the reach of draft boards unless there is a sharp increase from recent manpower demands.

An executive order, signed Wednesday before the President left for his Georgia vacation and made public by the White House Thursday, puts childless registrants

aged 19 through 25 at the top of the list in a new order of call-ups.

With an estimated 1,347,000 registrants now in that seven-year age bracket, yearly additions can be expected to approach 200,000.

A Selective Service spokesman said calls were 6,000 men for February, 16,000 for March.

At the highest of those rates—16,000—the annual call-up would be under 200,000.

The new system, the White House said, will be "less disruptive to the

community as well as more advantageous to the armed forces."

It added the order will have the additional effect of making younger men more conscious of their military obligation and of the advantages of the early completion of military training and service.

In that respect, it was said, it will assist in meeting the goals of the 1955 Reserve Forces Act.

In the past, fatherhood has not been a factor in whether or when a man was called. Registrants have been called starting with the top age—35 under the law but

slightly lower than that in practice—and working down.

The new order sets up four categories of registrants in the order in which they will be drafted for 24 months of training.

The first category provides for calling up the oldest 25-year-olds who are not fathers and going down the list to the youngest 19-year-olds.

Category 2, to be operative once the first category is exhausted, provides for starting with the oldest 25-year-old father and going down to the youngest 19-year-old father. There are an estimated 150,000 in this group.

Category 3 provides for calling the youngest 26-year-olds and working upward, regardless of whether the registrant is a father. In this

group there are an estimated 18,000.

Under category 4 the services would take the oldest 18-year-olds, regardless of fatherhood, on down to 18½ years which is the bottom age limit. There are 210,000 in this group.

It emphasized that the order does not reclassify any registrants. No new deferments or exemptions are provided, nor are the ones now in effect altered by the change in the order of call.
