

Apr. 1 Deadline For Veterans' Tax Exemptions

Disabled war veterans and war widows must apply by April 1 for state property tax exemptions, the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs warned today.

The exemption for those entitled amounts to \$7,500 of the true cash value of the property, according to Vere A. McCarthy, service officer for the state veterans' department. Application is filed with the county assessor. Entitled to the tax exemption on their real or personal property are the following:

1. All veterans of the Indian, Mexican or Spanish-American wars regardless of disability or amount of income.
2. Veterans of all other wars including the Korean conflict who have disabilities of 40 per cent or more as certified by the Veterans Administration or a branch of the Armed Forces, regardless of income.
3. Unmarried widows of veterans of any war, regardless of income. Pensioned widows of Civil and Spanish war veterans get an extra \$500 exemption.
4. War veterans with disabilities of 40 per cent or more as certified by their physician and the county health officer, provided they have not received more than \$2,500 total gross income in the past calendar year.

The exemption applies first to the applicant's homestead — that is, the property he owns and on which he resides. After that, it applies to his personal property.

Further information is available from county assessors.

Adlai Stevenson Supports 90 Per Cent Parity Plan

KENNEWICK, Wash. (AP) — Adlai Stevenson expressed support here this week for the 90 per cent of parity formula for aiding farmers.

The contender for the Democratic nomination for President said in a speech prepared for a party luncheon that "we must begin with the fact that the farmer not only needs help from his government, but he deserves it."

"We know where to start," he declared, "and this is where we left off in 1952, with the parity formula for fairness based on relating what a farmer gets for what he sells to what he must pay for what he buys. And 90 per cent of what is fair is certainly not unfair or too high."

"Support of government loans at 90 per cent of parity for basic commodities did a part of the job of shoring up farm income and they can do it again."

January Proves Soaking Month, Records Reveal

January would have been a record-breaking month for precipitation had it not been for December. Figures for the first month of 1956 show it still was a "soaking" month.

The Douglas County Water Resources Survey Office has tabulated figures from 13 of 25 gauges throughout the county.

So far, the Idlewild-Rock Creek area takes top honors with 16.25 inches of precipitation in January. The Steamboat Ranger Station gauge showed 15.41 inches, the Weyerhaeuser camp east of Sutherling 14.30 inches and Flounroy Valley west of Roseburg 13.94 inches.

The lowest figure turned in so far is from the Coyote gauge near Tiller, 6.41 inches. Roseburg recorded 9.90.

Other figures are Elkhead 12.88, Reston 12.46, Curtin 12.14, Little River 10.81, North Myrtle 10.47, Devils Flat 10.31 and Winchester 9.57.

No January record is available from Marial on the west fork of Cow Creek, but it is known that the gauge there had 35.47 inches of precipitation from Dec. 5 to Feb. 3.

Greatest one-day precipitation in January was 3.10 inches in the Rock Creek area on Jan. 15. Flounroy Valley recorded 2.83 inches on Jan. 7, another wet day throughout the county.

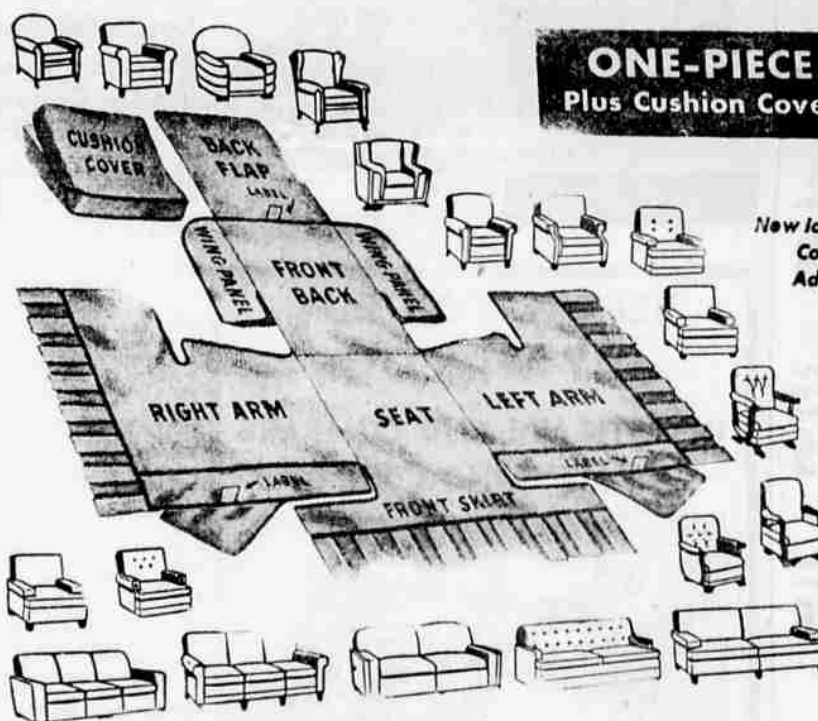

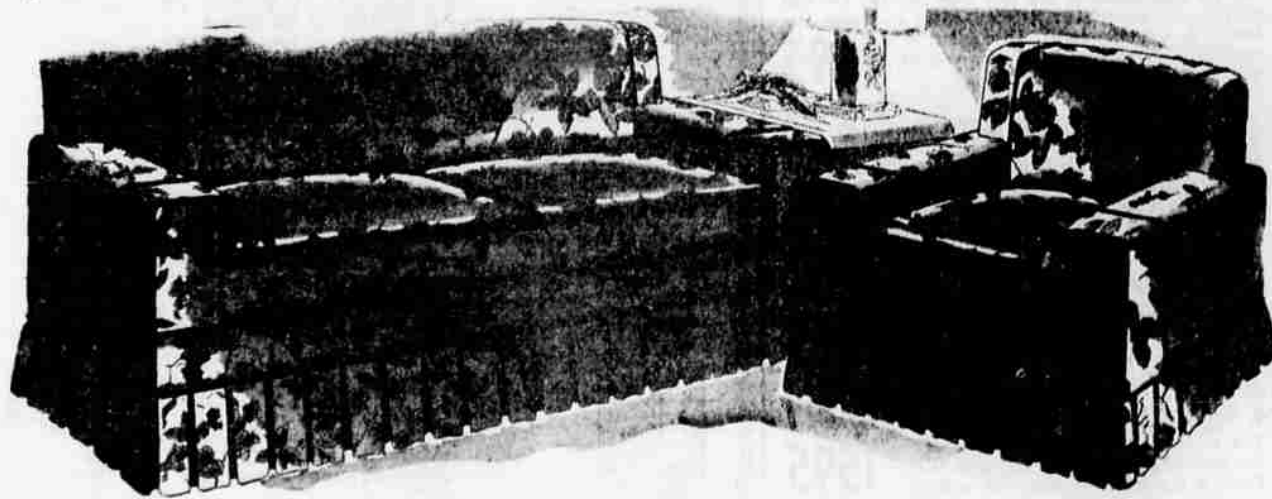

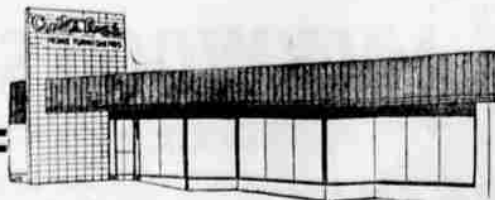
