## NW Construction Bounces Back From Slow Start

SEATTLE (AP) — Bouncing back from a slow December, building construction in the Pacific Northwest in January increased 92 per cent for a total of \$27,822,238, the Equitable Savings & Loan Association reported Saturday.  
The figures cover total construction in 48 cities in Washington, Oregon, Idaho and British Columbia. Of the January total, \$6,569,989 was for residential construction. Total construction in December was \$14,464,732, and in January, 1955, \$22,634,920.  
Home construction in January was up 68 per cent from December but remained 26 per cent under January, 1955.  
A 22-story, \$6,950,000 office building in Vancouver, B. C. helped boost the January total.  
Oregon, Washington and British Columbia reported strong gains in value over December. Idaho, Oregon and British Columbia reported healthy increases over January. Washington showed a 37 per cent gain over December, but a 14 per cent decrease from January, 1955.
