

**NOTICE OF SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND
ELECTION AND NOTICE OF LEVY
OUTSIDE THE SIX PERCENT CON-
STITUTIONAL LIMITATION IN
SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 4 OF
DOUGLAS COUNTY, OREGON**

The issue with reference to the levy is a special election outside of the present constitutional amendment. The levy will have a special tax levied in the sum of \$1,009,621.35 over and above the six percent constitutional limitation. The School Board of Douglas County, Oregon, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1956, has proposed a 10 percent increase of increased enrollment, including teachers' salaries, equipment purchased, and other items to be paid by the operating cost of the District."

On said proposition the vote shall be by a majority of the voters on the words "Tax Levy Yes" and "Tax Levy - No", and the voters shall place their ballot between the words "Tax Levy - Yes" or between the words "Tax Levy - No", whichever indicates their choice.

Said election for the submission of said proposition shall be held at the following places, to-wit: at the following school election precincts comprising the following:

SCHOOL PRECINCT NO. 1. Polling place Central Junior High Building, 1001 1/2 N. Main, Astoria, Oregon. Umpqua, Benson, Lane, Deer Creek, East Hill and West Hill election precincts.

SCHOOL PRECINCT NO. 2. Polling place, Senior High School, For all the precincts in the following: Astoria, North Brown, Fairhaven, Laurelswood, West Roseburg, Wharton, Park and
