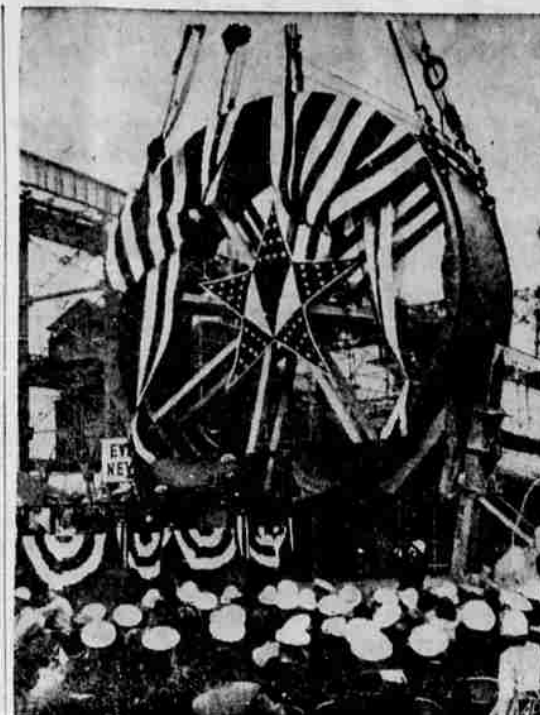

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Kefauver Still Mulls Oregon Primary Entry

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Kefauver (D-Tenn.) expects to decide within the next 10 days whether he will enter the Oregon Democratic presidential primary election.

"There's a good likelihood we will enter," he said, but he added he wants to be sure that participation in the Oregon campaign will not conflict with Senate business and with other engagements. The senator said he had notified Sen. Morse (D-Ore.) of his interest in the state primary. The latter, he said, was in reply to one he had received from Morse in which Morse stated he would welcome both Kefauver and Adlai Stevenson in the Oregon primary.
