

Winters Moves Into Top Spot In NW Scoring

March may have arrived on schedule but Winters' still with us. This would be Jimmy Winters of Portland University, a cool-cool cager who heated up his scoring tempo last week and now rates No. 1 in the Pacific Northwest's tally parade with 533 points.

Nudges Stricklin
Winters took back the lead from Dick Stricklin of Seattle U. when rangy Richard went into a three-game slump and tumbled all the way to third place. The Eastern Oregon College ace, Ted Schade-witz, ambled into second spot with 327 points to Stricklin's 315.

And Schade-witz topped the region in per-game production with an average of 21.97 over his 24-game schedule. Winters and Stricklin each had been out 26 times when the books closed Feb. 26 for the weekly tabulation.

Cal Bauer of Seattle, although he remained in fourth place, collected 71 points in three games to edge up on the leaders, checking in with 528 points. One other Southern Oregon College climber into the rare air of the 500s with 502.

More Than 390
It took more than 390 points to land a man in the week's top 20 and low man in the Top Ten—R. C. Owens of College of Idaho—made the grade with 465. Eighteen players were above the 400 mark.

Most of the players have only tourney action ahead and team play could be the deciding factor in this year's scoring leadership. The farther a team goes in the tourneys, the better will be the chances of its ace to finish on top. The first five men all appear to retain a chance for the title.

PORTLAND — Portland State defeated Lewis & Clark, 76-74, in an inter-conference basketball game decided Wednesday night on free throws after the game's time had run out.

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Russell, Freeman Top All Americas

NEW YORK — Dominated by big Bill Russell and little Robin Freeman, five seniors from San Francisco, Ohio State, Duquesne, Furman and Holy Cross were named Thursday to the 1956 Associated Press collegiate All-America basketball team.

Others On Team

Selected with Russell and Freeman by a vote of 329 sportswriters and broadcasters were Sihugo (SI) Green of Duquesne, Darrell Floyd of Furman and Tom Heinsohn of Holy Cross. Russell, Freeman and Floyd are repeaters from the 1955 All-America while Green moves up from the 1955 second team and Heinsohn from the 1955 third team.

The 6-10 Russell, who ailed fans all over the country during the Dons' early season cross-country trek enroute to their string of 48 straight victories, received 308 first team votes and seven 2nd team marks for a total of 1,354 points. Five points were given for a first team vote, two for the second team. Freeman, only 5-11 but one of the nation's best shooters, polled 233 firsts and 46 seconds for 1,257 points.

Green was third in the voting with 861 points on 153 firsts and 48 seconds followed by Floyd with 813 on 125-94 and Heinsohn with 824 on 98-82.

Second Team

Ronnie Schavlik, North Carolina State star who fractured his wrist last Saturday; K. C. Jones, Russell's teammate at San Francisco; Rod (Hot Rod) Hundley of West Virginia; Len Rosenbluth of North Carolina and 7 ft. Bill Uhl of Dayton were picked as a second team.

George Washington's 6-4 star, Joe Holup; Julius McCoy of Michigan State; little 5-9 Bill Ridley of Illinois; Bob Burrow of Kentucky and Willie Naulls of UCLA make up a third team.

Charles Tyra of Louisville; Paul Judson of Illinois; Hal Lear of Temple; Morris Taft of UCLA and Vic Molodet of North Carolina State head an honorable mention list of 21. The 15 on the first three teams will receive certificates from the Associated Press.

Others receiving honorable mention included Art Bunte, Utah; George Selleck, Stanford; Terry Tebbis, Brigham Young, and Joe Capua, Wyoming.

Russell Gets Offer Of \$50,000 Deal

OAKLAND, Calif. — Big Bill Russell, 6 feet 10 All-America basketball center for San Francisco's undefeated Dons, Thursday was mulling over reports of a \$50,000 offer from the Harlem Globetrotters to turn pro after the 1956 Olympics.

The dunk-shot artist gasped: "I'm shocked, that would increase my yearly earnings by roughly \$50,000. I'm interested, but I'm not committing myself."

NEW YORK — Robin Freeman's chances of beating Furman's Darrell Floyd out of the major college individual basketball scoring championship are slim but the Ohio State All-America could well become the third highest point maker in history.

UCLA Coach Thinks Naulls Tops Russell

LOS ANGELES — Basketball Coach Johnny Wooden, never one to foster justified halcyon, none the less thinks his own UCLA star, Willie (The Whale) Naulls, is a better all-around player than Russell.

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And without meaning to under-rate Russell, Wooden commented: "Russell will be on everybody's All-America team, player of the year, and all of that. And he deserves it."

"But in my opinion, Willie's a better all-around player than Russell. Willie can do so many more things."

The 215-pound, 6-5 Naulls is the leading scorer in the Pacific Coast Conference, in which UCLA is unbeaten in 12 games, and he is far and away the leading rebounder with 179.
