### Dulles Warns Soviet Violence Held In Reserve

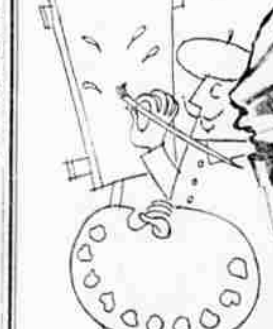
WASHINGTON (AP)—John Foster Dulles said today that the United States has "forces in being" should be backed by strategic striking power "suitably located."

The conference opened earlier Tuesday in the old Sine Assembly palace with a public session in which the eight foreign ministers put much emphasis on a need for combating Communist subversion and for improving economic conditions in the Asian member nations.

Dulles in his opening statement called on the eight nations to formulate a unified front against Red subversion in Asia and to develop "wholesome societies immune from Communist infection."
