Fire Rockets At Night, Advise Of Researcher

PASADENA, Calif. — More rockets should be fired at night to determine what happens when they meet meteor particles.

So says Dr. Fritz Zwicky, of California Institute of Technology, one of the farthest-out of outer space thinkers.

"Only at night," Dr. Zwicky told a Caltech research conference yesterday, "can we observe the flashes that would be made if the rocket were struck and pierced by bits of meteors traveling at speeds up to 38 miles per second."

Zwicky is optimistic about the safety of tomorrow's potential space travelers.

"My guess is that few, if any, spacecrafts are destined to be struck by large meteors that would knock them to bits," he said.

Columbia Flood Said Inevitable Later This Year

PORTLAND — Heavy, mountain snow packs made a Columbia River flood inevitable this year. The only question is whether it will be a major flood or one of comparatively light damage.

So warns Anthony J. Polos, hydrologist in charge of the Weather Bureau River Forecast Center.

He said in his preliminary March forecast here that snow depth increased greatly in the major snow areas in February.

Polos mentioned Mt. Baker Lodge in the northern Washington Cascades, where the snow increased from 194 to 266 inches, and Mullian Pass on the Idaho-Montana divide, where February precipitation was 1 1/2 times greater than normal.

"Temperature and precipitation during the spring months are still the keys to the situation. In the Portland and Vancouver harbors it seems likely that a crest stage between 25 and 28 feet will be reached. With very favorable weather throughout the spring, the crest could be as low as 22 feet," he said.

At 22 feet, the river would be seven feet above Vancouver flood stage and four feet above the Portland harbor flood stage. In the past damage has been minor at that level.

But a 28-foot flood would be dangerous. Much of the lower river area is diked to protect above 30 feet, but damage still would be heavy. The river reached 30 feet in 1948, when the housing project of Vanport was wiped out and dozens of dikes crumbled under the water pressure.

Polos did not forecast river heights at other points, but said they would be announced next week, after further study of snow information.

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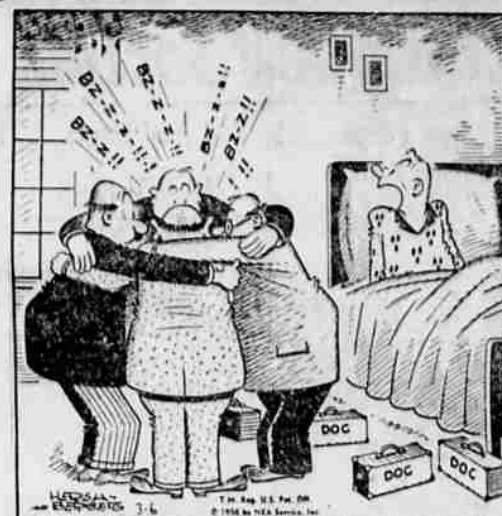
