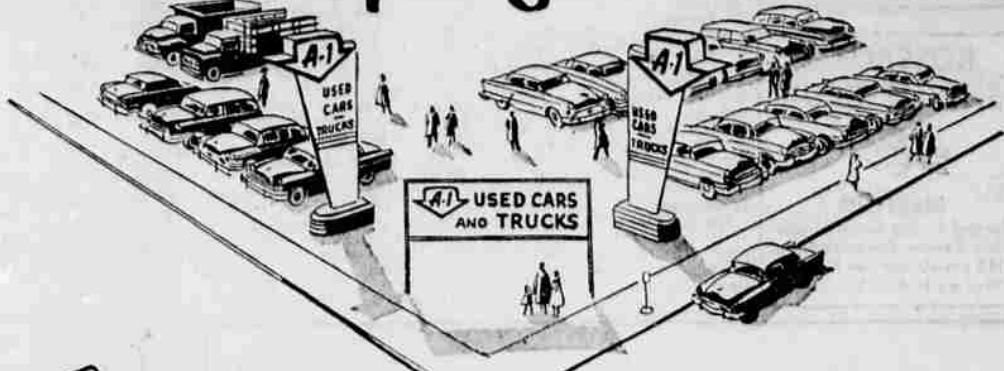
In Hospital
