

Johns-Manville Corp. Buys Klamath Property

PORTLAND (AP)—The Johns-Manville Corp. has bought 131 acres of land on the Klamath Indian

Reservation to get access to a site where it may build a hardboard plant. The Bureau of Indian Affairs announced that here this week. The land was bought for \$25,000 from Nicholas Rossi, an Indian who bought the trust allotment several years ago. Officials of the Interior Department said Johns-Manville was planning a plant which would produce hardboard from lodgepole pine, which is abundant in the area.

Porcupines Have Increased, Cause Great Damage

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Porcupines have mysteriously increased in such numbers that they are causing millions of dollars of damage in the nation's forests annually.

This report was made recently by E. L. Kolbe, chief forester for the Western Pine Assn., which is holding its annual meeting here. He said the situation is so serious the industry is sponsoring special schools teaching how young growing trees can be protected from the quilled varmints.

In an effort to find some method of controlling the increasing porcupine population, the pine association made a nationwide appeal for recipes for cooking porcupine meat, hoping to stimulate interest in hunting the animals.

"Frankly, we were doubtful about the whole matter at first, until the recipes began pouring in," Kolbe said. "Now we realize there is a proud fraternity of outdoor loving people who have developed what seem to be excellent methods for cooking the porcupine, which is edible and can be prepared into a variety of palatable dishes."

Kolbe has not tried any of the recipes himself.
