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Mrs. Germond, 74, Lifelong Resident, Dies At Hospital

Mrs. Cynthia E. Germond, 74, lifelong resident of Douglas County and well known resident of Roseburg died at a local hospital Friday, following a prolonged illness.

She was born at Yoncalla Aug. 27, 1881, the daughter of Daniel and Virginia Estes Applegate, pioneers of that community. She was the granddaughter of Jesse Applegate, early Oregon pioneer and founder of the Applegate trail as a route to western Oregon.

She was a graduate of the Drain Normal School and was married at Drain on Oct. 6, 1904, to Milton B. Germond, who preceded her in death Jan. 31, 1920. Mr. Germond at the time of his death was county surveyor for Douglas County. The family moved to Roseburg about 46 years ago.

She was a member of the First Christian Church and the Neighbors of Woodcraft Circle No. 49, for which she served as secretary for the past 18 years.

Surviving are a son, Bernel C. Germond, Roseburg, two daughters, Mrs. E. L. (Lucile) Wertz, Portland, and Mrs. C. M. (Dorothy) Saar, Roseburg. She is also survived by a sister, Mrs. Minnie Barker, Sandee, Ore., and two granddaughters, Patricia and Charlene Dent, Roseburg.

General services will be held in the chapel of Long & Orr Mortuary, Monday, March 12, at 11 a.m. The Rev. Newell Morgan of the First Christian Church will officiate. Concluding services and vault interment will follow in the Roseburg memorial gardens.
