Congressmen Get Assurance Plea

WASHINGTON — A group of West Coast congressmen Friday reported assurance by Defense Secretary Wilson that he will investigate their plea for increased use of locally owned docks for overseas cargo shipments.

The congressmen, who met with Wilson Thursday, were Reps. Mack (R-Wash.), Norblad (R-Ore.) and Allen and Mailliard (R-Calif.). Also at the meeting were Dudley W. Frost, general port manager, Oakland, and president of the Pacific Coast Assn. of Port Authorities; D. L. Dullum, president of the California Assn. of Port Authorities; Carlis Stettin, manager, Port of Olympia, Wash.; and Charles Tait, director, Port of San Francisco.

Mack told a newsmen Friday the group presented figures to Wilson showing that while locally owned wharves handled 34 per cent of all overseas military cargo from 1951 to 1953, the percentage had declined to 24 per cent in 1954.
