Report Censured Out Of Moscow, States Newsman

(Editor's Note: Stanley Johnson, a member of the AP staff in Moscow, has been trying for five days to get the censor to pass a story on the speech by N. S. Khrushchev on Stalin. This story was received from Johnson Saturday.)

MOSCOW, Jan. 28.—N. S. Khrushchev, boss of the Soviet Communist Party, made a secret speech at the recent 20th party congress explaining the reasons for collective leadership and the harm done by one-man rule such as prevailed under Stalin.

Because it was considered an entirely internal party affair, foreign delegates were barred from the hall when the speech was made.

It was embodied in the form of a long, slow, party organization throughout the Soviet Union. For the past week there have been meetings of party activists, where the letter was read.

They are passing the word of its contents down and thus the speech will gradually spread throughout the country in an ever widening spiral.

Even now it is a main subject of conversation, especially among informed westerners most of whom—especially newspapermen—are pretty knowledgeable about the contents.

They have also been well filled in on the details of the activist meetings.

The entire subject has been blazed out here and this all one can say now after five days of intensive efforts to report it more thoroughly.
