MAHE, Seychelles Islands in—
Archbishop Makarios, exiled leader of the Cyprus movement for union with Greece, went shopping Tuesday for some tropical underwear.
The bearded, 42-year-old patriarch of the Greek Orthodox Church, was allowed to leave his hilltop lodge along with a fellow exile, the Bishop of Kyrenia, Police escorted them through the crowds of shoppers in Port Victoria.
It was near the area that the archbishop and his party had landed from a British naval frigate six days ago. This was Archbishop Makarios' first trip away from the white stone lodge which is his exile home on this tropical island in the Indian Ocean.
He spends his time reading, listening to phonograph records or playing the palm fringed grounds.
