

President Of Isaac Walton League Asks For Revocation Of License For Pelton Dam

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Portland, Ore., lawyer and sportsman Tuesday asked revocation of the license for Pelton Dam on Oregon's Deschutes River "so we in Oregon can determine what is the best use for our waters."

Rollin E. Bowles, president of the Oregon Isaac Walton League, appeared before a Senate Commerce Subcommittee considering a bill to revoke the Federal Power Commission's license to Port-

land General Electric Co. for construction of the dam.

The license, opposed by the Oregon fish and game commissions, was upheld by the Supreme Court in a case which attracted wide attention through the West.

The court held the Power Commission was within its authority to issue the license inasmuch as the dam would be on federal land reserved as a power site. Because of this, the court said, state law Bowles, however, emphasized would not prevail.

That a regulating dam be built to level out water level fluctuations caused by Pelton's operations would be on state land over which the federal government has no jurisdiction.

He said the Deschutes River is one of the Lower Columbia tributaries which Army engineers have recommended be reserved for fish production. He cited an estimate that the river can be made to produce not less than 20 per cent of the Columbia River's spring chinook salmon run.

Karl W. Onthank of Eugene, president of the Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs, said the 108,000 kilowatts of power which would be produced at Pelton would be only seven-tenths of one per cent of the power output of Pacific Northwest power dams already built or under construction.

This, he said, would be a "rather insignificant addition" compared with the loss of recreational values that would result.

Sens. Morse and Neuberger, Oregon Democrats, co-sponsors of the bill, urged the subcommittee to approve it, as did Charles H. Callison, conservation director for the National Wildlife Federation.

Morse said the Supreme Court's decision was based on a "technical difference" between public lands and reserved lands which "has no support in policy considerations."

He said the decision "does endanger state authority in private license proceedings for projects on wholly intrastate, non-navigable streams."

Morse said he felt cancellation of a fresh start on attempts to use the site for "power and preservation of fish runs."

"However, if a final choice must be made between relatively small power production and the irreplaceable commercial and sports fish runs, the latter have higher social utility in this area," Neuberger said that if it were a

choice between developing the Deschutes or a shortage of electricity, he would choose development. But he contended that the choice is not necessary in view of the vast undeveloped power sites remaining on the Columbia.

William N. Waugh, aide to Rep. Coon (R-Ore.), read into the record a telegram from the Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce, asking an opportunity to appear in opposition to the bill.

Sen. Pastore (D-R.I.), acting chairman, assured Waugh that Tuesday's session was merely to accommodate Oregonians now here on other business. He said further hearings would be held at which all desiring will be given opportunity to testify.
