

Ambassador Nominated For Afghanistan Duty

WASHINGTON — President Eisenhower Tuesday nominated Sheldon T. Mills, now ambassador to Ecuador, to be ambassador to Afghanistan.

Mills, 51, would succeed veteran diplomat Angus Ward, whose resignation was announced by the White House Tuesday. The nomination is subject to Senate confirmation. Mills has been in the foreign service since 1928. He is a legal resident of Portland, Ore.

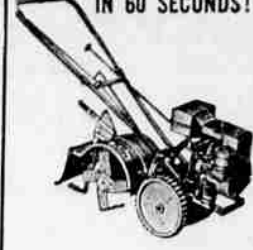
