Juvenile Services Survey Is Step Toward Flexibility In Dealing With Offenders

Circuit Judge Charles S. Woodrich sees the need of a survey of juvenile court services in Douglas County as the first step toward more flexibility in present methods of dealing with young offenders.

There is little choice now in what action can be taken when a youth is taken into court, little choice between sending the youngster to MacLaren School, where incorrigibles are sent, and in letting the youth "go free" (placed on probation to his parents).

Some intermediate courses of action should be available to the court, Judge Woodrich believes. Specifically, there should be three other alternatives, he says:

1. Foster homes. It is practically impossible at the moment to find a family willing to accept the responsibility of having a teen-age offender in their home.
2. A detention facility. None exists now. The judge is interested in surveying the feasibility of using such a home jointly with Lane County. In a 52-page Lane County report by the National Probation & Parole Assn., it is recommended that "Lane County undertake to construct a single unit fire-proof detention home, with a normal capacity of 15 children, requiring secure custody and that the feasibility of a larger regional detention home to serve Benton, Linn and Douglas counties be explored." There are some cases, Woodrich states, in which the offender should have a short term of detention rather than being sent to MacLaren to mix with more hardened offenders.
3. A disciplinary camp. None exists now. Woodrich points out that a disciplinary camp system has worked with apparent success

Trial Of Fong Gets Under Way

PORTLAND — Opening statements by the defense and prosecution were to get underway here Thursday in the first degree murder trial of Wayne Fong.

He is accused of slaying Diane Hank, 16, who disappeared after spending the night at the Fong home in January, 1934.

Her body, trussed in a blanket, was found some time later in a roadside ditch near Washougal, Wash.

This is the second time Fong has faced trial on the murder charge. He and his wife, Sherry, were convicted of first degree murder at a joint trial. The verdict was set aside, however, and new separate trials ordered.

Mrs. Fong was convicted of second degree murder at her later trial and now is appealing to the Oregon Supreme Court.

A jury of six men and six women, sworn in Tuesday, will decide Fong's fate.

Concert Assn. Piano Installed

Meanwhile, the association's membership campaign is under full swing with expectations that the membership list will be filled this week. Memberships are limited to the capacity of the auditorium. The list was opened to the public Wednesday. Prior to that preference was given former members.

Miss Strong urged association workers not to delay in sending in memberships so that an accurate check may be kept and the list not exceeded.
