Notice is given hereby that Harley T. France has filed an application for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from the

Certificate of water right issued to H. T. France and recorded at page 11633, Vol. 10, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms a right under Permit 11988 for the use of water of Cow Creek for the irrigation of 10 acres in NE 1/4, NW 1/4, and 20 acres in SE 1/4, NW 1/4, Sec. 14, T. 22 S., R. 5 W., W.M. These lands are irrigated through the Johna ditch, the point of diversion of said ditch being located 495 ft. S. & 900 ft. Registrations Being Taken For 'Y' Diamond Lake Camp

Registration for the YMCA boys camp at Diamond Lake is now open.

Forest Service Division Chief Served In Umpqua

Douglas School Population Continues To Grow; Most Districts Report Increases

Douglas County's school population, like Topsy, continues to grow. School census figures released by County School Supt. Kenneth F. Barneburg show enrollment up 962 for 1935-36 over the 1934-35 figure of 21,519. The new total is 22,481.

It is a percentage gain of 4.3. All figures released are "as of Oct. 25, 1935."

Hottest numerical increase came in the county's largest district — Roseburg's District 4. The new sum of 7,280 is a 7.3 per cent climb over the previous year's 6,732.

Percentage-wise Reedsport nosed out little Tiller. The Reedsport district showed a 10.6 gain, for an increase of 143 for a total of 1,357. Tiller climbed by 22 to 232 for a 9.5 per cent jump.

Not all districts increased. Oakland slumped 13.6 per cent to 819. A drop of 129 students over the previous year's 948.

Galloping Sutherlin, next door, climbed 101 for a new figure of 1,877 over 1,776.

Financially poor Dillard, like another moneyless district — Sutherlin, showed a pupil gain. District 118 raced upward to 1,987. An increase of 146 over the 1,841 figure of 1934-35. The per cent jump was 7.4.

To the south, Myrtle Creek enrolled 55 new students, for a total of 2,189. Canyonville and Days Creek showed slight decreases. Canyonville lost three pupils for a new figure of 604. Days Creek dropped eight to 320.

Glendale continued to grow. The most recent census shows 1,069 students, a jump of 39 over the former year. Directly north, the

Soloists will be Lawrence Tibbett, baritone, and Richard Crooks, tenor. The singing group will be the Trinity Choir.



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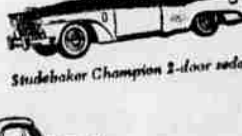
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
