Downhill, Slalom Scheduled At Taft

The Sunday preliminary to the Edelweiss Ski Club Races will be open to all skiers, club members or not, according to Fred Weber, meet director.

Free club memberships await the man and woman winners in the Sunday races, Weber said. There will be a 1,000-foot downhill run and two slalom runs, one with seven and one with eight gates. The persons scoring the lowest combined times will be declared winners. Other small merchandise prizes also will be awarded.

Godoy last Saturday night took advantage of the ropes to defeat Waldo, but John Horn, chairman of the Roseburg Boxing Commission, ordered both belt and pay held up. Then Godoy was instructed to meet Waldo in a finish match this Saturday.

Godoy's conduct this week will determine whether he receives his pay from last week. Waldo, no angel himself, will be out to avenge Godoy's rope trick. After the bout, Waldo lost his temper, knocked down the referee with a head butt, then clamped a full nelson on the champ.

Godoy, rough and experienced, has the backbreaker and crab as his pet holds. Waldo depends on head butts and the full nelson. The winner must post two falls. There is no time limit. In the semi-windup, Irish Jack O'Reilly, a roughie from Australia, will meet Rito Romero. Romero won four straight here before being held to a draw last week by Bill Fletcher. The match will go two of three falls in a 30-minute time limit.

In the distances, senior lettermen Dick Geary and Bill Levins and junior numeral — winners Gary Zosel and Dennis Hess make the Warriors appear well-set. Geary and Zosel are mile specialists and Hess will enter the 880.

Other lettermen on the squad are Charles Huckins in the hurdles, Ed Burns in the shot put, Paul Reel in the discus, Bob Black in the javelin and Jack Shaw in the high jump.

Seniors Dale Dowdy and Jack Evans, though they haven't lettered, will enter the high jump. Bill Walton the javelin and Gordon Benham the broad jump. Junior Frank Sneed is a discus thrower.

For sprinters, Heater lists Eddy Johnston and Charles Copeland. Both are sophomores. Dick Crites, a freshman, is a 440-yard man. Albert Sowell and Eugene Merrill, both freshmen, are going out for the pole vault.

Other candidates include: Jerry Nash, Bob Seaton, Jim Skates, Stan Carter and Eddie Tanney, all sophomores; and Cliff Peronto, John Blackledge, Alvin Emel, Larry Vinyard and Don Work, freshmen.

Other races drawing top performers include the 100-yard dash and high hurdles. Two sprinters who have been clocked at 9.6, Gordon Busse and Sam McWhirter, will meet Northwest college dash men in the 100. Busse and McWhirter are soldiers at Ft. Lewis, Wash.

Swimmer Cracks 1,500 Meter Mark
NEW HAVEN, Conn. — What do you have to do to lower the world's long — course 1,500-meter swimming record by 13.1 seconds?

"You have to swim like hell," says George Breen of Portland (N.Y.) State Teachers College, and he should know.

The 20-year-old swimming sensation from Buffalo, N.Y., did it with a spectacular 18:05.9 last night as he got the three-day NCAA Swimming Championships going.

Breen beat the 18:19 recorded by Hironoshin Furuhashi of Japan at Los Angeles nearly seven years ago. Yale's Bob Kiputh, a famed Olympic coach, said this establishes the modest youngsters as the world's greatest long-distance swimmers today.

Others said Breen's time was the equivalent of a runner doing a 4-minute mile in track.
