The vote came after the reading of a critical resolution passed by the Bend Central Labor Council. A resolution censuring Gov. Smith also was approved last weekend by the Oregon Typographers Conference in Corvallis.

Bill Wray, president of the Portland council, said at Monday night's meeting that the "governor is against labor like dogs are against cats."

Ceiling Of Synagogue Collapses; Three Hurt

NEW YORK (AP) — The ceiling of a Bronx synagogue collapsed during a Passover service Tuesday, injuring three women worshippers. Two were reported in critical condition.

All three women were seated in the balcony. Some 30 other persons in the congregation escaped injury despite the rain of plaster and debris. Cantor Max Weisen was leading the congregation in prayer commemorating the exodus of Jews from Egyptian bondage more than 3,000 years ago when a 20 by 30 foot section of the ceiling crashed at 8:55 a.m. The synagogue is Yeshiva and Mesivta Zichron Moshe.
