1956 Oregon Fire Season Goes Into Effect Sunday, Announces Forest Agencies

The 1956 Oregon fire season will be in effect officially on Sunday, State Forest Dept. and Douglas Forest Protection Assn. officials announced today.

After today, burning permits must be obtained from any forest protective station or forestry officer.

The setting of the fire season has important consequences to all loggers and sawmills operating on DFLA-protected lands. State requirements become effective Sunday.

Sufficient hand tools to equip every man on a logging or sawmilling operation must be in a red tool box marked "For Fire Only," and placed at the operation.

Arresters Required

Spark arresters are required on all steam or internal combustion engines, unless specifically exempt in writing by a fire-suppression agency. Fire extinguishers must be provided on all engines. These must be a minimum of 1½-quart capacity or the equivalent, except on power saws, which must have an extinguisher of at least 8 ounces capacity. Power saw operators also must be equipped with a shovel having at least a 36-inch handle.

Operations north of closure zone 16 (Canyon Mountain divide) must be equipped with a humidity instrument capable of measuring the relative humidity. All such operations are required to close down all power-driven equipment when the relative humidity drops to 30 per cent or lower.

All landings for logging engine settings must have inflammable

debris cleared for a distance of at least 30 feet. A clearing of at least 200 feet around a sawmill is required.

Watchman Needed

Any operator using power-driven equipment, unless specifically modified or exempt by a forest inspector, must provide a watchman on the operation until 8 p.m. every day equipment is operated for three hours after the opera-

tion ceases, whichever is later.

The operator of power-driven equipment must also provide, unless exempt in writing, a pump capable of producing 40 pounds pressure at the end of 500 feet of ½-inch hose through a ¼-inch nozzle. That amount of hose and the nozzle must be provided, along with an adequate water supply, to be determined by a forest inspector.

During the fire season, the use of fuses in blasting is prohibited. All blasting must be confined to the use of electric caps.

Smoking Prohibited

Smoking is prohibited while working in the operation or traveling in or through the operation or unreleased slash area. Persons wishing to smoke should stop work or travel and be in a cleared location before lighting up.

All trucks driven over forest roads for use in the woods must be equipped with a shovel, axe and an extinguisher of at least 1½-quart size.

An all-year requirement is the holding of a forest operation and harvesting permit before an operation can start, the forest officials reminded.

Snags over 16 inches in diameter and 25 feet in height must be felled with the timber being harvested.

Snags over 15 feet in height within 200 feet of a landing must be felled before machinery is operated.

Any operation found in violation will be closed until requirements are met. Operators will be subject to arrest, forest officials warned.
