**Oregon Counties Given
Highway Funds Share**

SALEM (AP) — Oregon counties
were given \$2,371,625 Thursday as
their 19 per cent share of state
highway revenues, Secretary of
State Earl T. Newberry announced.
The apportionment is for the
three months ended March 31.
Newberry also distributed \$55,766
in liquor revenues to counties and
cities, and \$4,274 in amusement
device tax receipts to counties.

Committee Hopes To Face Bonds Transactions

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Mc-
Clellan (D-Ark.) said this week
he "hopes to nail down by Tues-
day" why \$40,000 of coupons from
bonds bought by business rivals
Joseph (Joey) Abrams and Her-
man Kravitz allegedly wound up
in the same bank account—under
another man's name.

Bond transactions involving the
names of Abrams and Kravitz are
a key issue in public hearings be-
fore McClellan's Senate Investi-
gations Subcommittee, which is
studying the purchase of millions
of dollars worth of Army uni-
forms between 1951 and 1953.

Abrams owns garment plants
in Brooklyn, N. Y., and Kravitz
has others in Atlantic City and
Millville, N. J. The subcommittee
said both were barred from fur-
ther government contracts after a
government investigation in 1953.
McClellan told reporters the in-
quiry has produced no evidence
thus far of either graft or tax

The hearings, which started
Tuesday, were recessed Wednes-
day until next week after two wit-
nesses asked further time to ob-
tain lawyers.

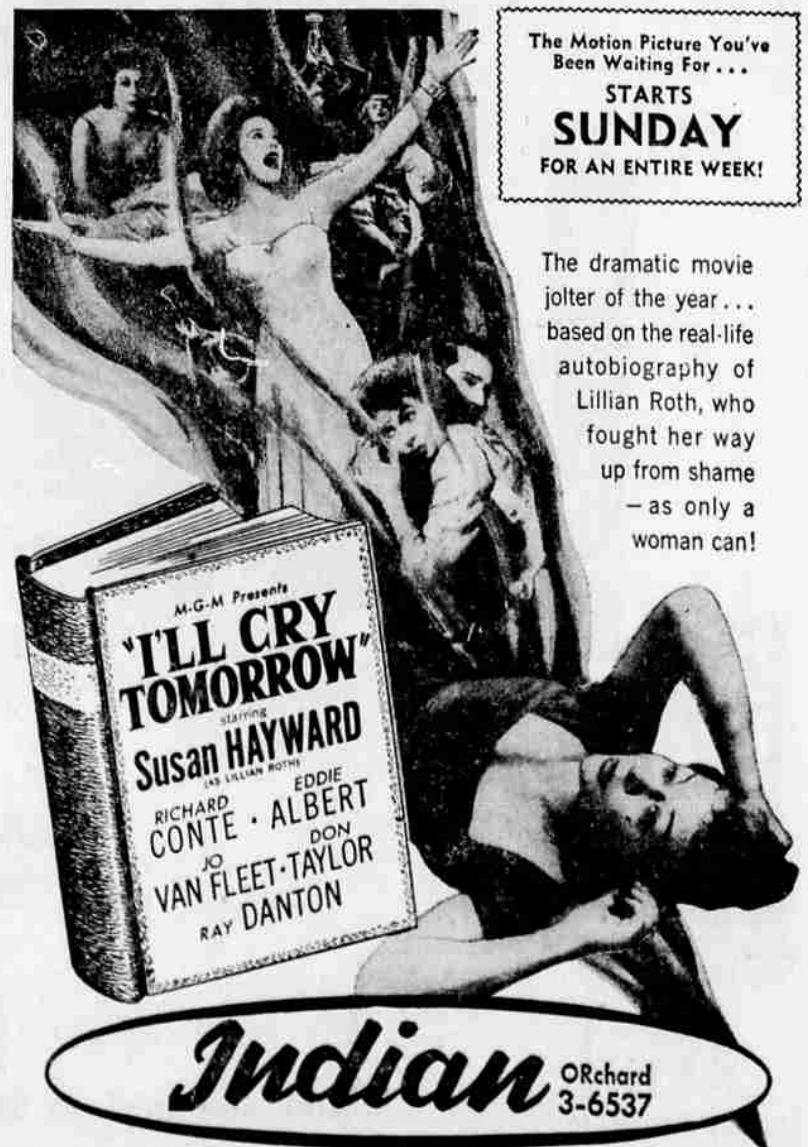
