

# Hank Sauer Stages Comeback With Cards

It looks like Hank Sauer, who at 37 is a misfit in the St. Louis Cardinals' accent on youth, may fill the bill for Manager Fred Hutchinson just by doing what comes naturally — hammering home runs and looking with indifference on opposing southpaws.

"We've got the speed to steal, take the extra base and hit-and-run," Hutch observed this spring. "but let's not kid ourselves. We need a guy who can hit the long ball."

General Manager Frank Lane exchanged for utility man Pete

Whisenant and a few bulls, correlated Sauer from the Chicago Cubs with the comment Hank not only presented a long ball threat, but as a right-handed swinger in left countercurrents some of the southpaw pitchers who have given the Cards, heavy with left-handed hitters, so much trouble.

**Sauer Blasts Homers**  
In the last two days, Hank has teamed with Stan (The Man) Musial for back-to-back home runs — each time off southpaws. Wednesday he mobbed the Chicago White Sox' Jack Harshman to overcome a 3-0 deficit. Yesterday they made up a 2-0 handicap on consecutive pitches by Ludy Pierce and the Cardinals went on to score three in the 10th to nail the Sox 5-2.

That kind of swinging could put Sauer in left field opening day at Cincinnati against the Redlegs' ace lefty, Joe Nuxhall. Even before Hank joined in the power partnership with the Musial, Hutchinson admitted he had an edge over slumping regular Rip Repulski.

Rookie Jackie Brandt, also in the battle for an outfield berth, whacked a double in the winning rally off Morrie Martin as the Cards made it four straight over the Sox. Veterans didn't snare the New York Giants until the 11th when Jim Constable forced Colavito home.

Bauer's poke, off Bill Kennedy, broke a 7-7 tie in the eighth after Mickey McDermott and Jim Konstanty had blown a 6-0 Yank lead. Wally Post smacked a three-run homer off McDermott.
