Seattle and San Diego, first and second in the Pacific Coast League much of last season, are at it again this year.
They open a four-game series at San Diego Friday night with the Padres in first place, a half game ahead of Seattle.
San Diego won its fourth straight Thursday night, defeating Vancouver, 4-1.
San Francisco knocked Seattle out of first place with a 5-2 victory, the Seals' first over the

Raiders. Powerful hitting gave Los Angeles an 11-5 margin over Portland and Sacramento put its only five hits together for a seven-run inning to top Hollywood, 7-4.
Padres Stop Mounties
San Diego's Pete Mesa threw a five-hitter to beat Vancouver, getting a save from Al Gettel in the ninth. The win was Mesa's second against no losses. Mesa would have had a shutout except for a balk in the sixth that let Jim Pisoni score.
Dick Sisler hit two singles and a double for San Diego.
Righthander Eddie Erault (0-2) goes for the Padres Friday night against Seattle lefty Fred Baczewski (1-0).
San Francisco's Russ Kemmerer got his second win as he held Seattle to six hits. And he hit a bases-empty homer in the fifth to tie the score, 2-2. Gordy Windhorn drove in Albie Pearson, on with a triple for the winning run. The Seals added two more in the eighth.
Taylor Homers Again
Joe Taylor of Seattle got his third home run in two days in the fourth. Elmer Singleton was charged with the loss, his second against no wins.
At Sacramento, Hollywood's Curt Raydon threw six no-hit innings. Then Sacramento put together three walks and five hits, the last a booming double by Al Heist, who had opened the inning with a single. It took three Hollywood relief men to get the Solons out.
Los Angeles had a six-run sixth inning against Portland on five hits, a walk and an error. Winning pitcher Harry Perkowski and Steve Bilko homered for the Angels. The Beavers used five pitchers.

Herb Score, Cleveland's fine young southpaw, says he doesn't sleep well after losing. From the looks of things he could end up with insomnia just by facing the Chicago White Sox.
Score was the American League's No. 1 rookie last season, with a 16-10 mark and a record 245 strikeouts — but he couldn't beat Chicago in three tries.
Even though figured to win 20 this season, he found himself in the same old nightmare alley yesterday. He fanned 10 and gave just two hits, yet lost 1-0 to the White Sox, who got a two-hitter themselves from Jack Harshman and scored the lone run without a hit.
With that follow-up to Billy Pierce's 2-1, five-hit victory, opening day, Chicago swept the two-game set between the two pennant threats and stayed unbeaten in the AL along with Boston, which defeated Baltimore 4-2 behind Tom Brewer's two-hitter, and Kansas City, which blanked Detroit 4-1 on Bobby Shantz' five-hit pitching. The New Yankees, after thumping Washington twice, were dumped by the Senators 7-1. Milwaukee Unbeaten
In the National, only Milwaukee remained unbeaten, edging the Chicago Cubs 3-1 while Pittsburgh knocked the New York Giants to their first defeat, 2-2. Brooklyn opened in its Jersey City "home" and beat Philadelphia 5-4 in 10 innings. Cincinnati also had to go 10 to beat St. Louis 10-9 with each club swatting four homers.
Score's big trouble with the White Sox, outside of yesterday's wildness, has been poor timing. He always runs into top pitching opponents. Last year he lost 4-3 against Pierce's three-hitter, 2-1 against Harshman's three-hitter, and 4-2 against Virgil Trucks' four-hitter.
Chicago didn't solve Herb for a hit until the eighth, but scored in the seventh on a walk, a two-run wild pitch and a sacrifice fly by ex-Triestman Larry Doby, who had struck out five times in a row.
Ball Falls Safely
At Boston, Brewer also got into trouble with walks, but Mickey Vernon smacked a fly which Dave Pope lost in the sun and fell for a two-run double to break a 3-all tie. Ted Williams was on the bench with a bruised instep.
The Senators got two in the first off ex-teammate Maury McDermott, then tied it in the fourth as Jim Lemon and Ed Fitz Gerald tagged the southpaw for solo homers. Chuck Stobbs held the Yanks to seven hits, including a homer and two singles by Elston Howard.
Ray Boone had three of Detroit's hits off Shantz, who was belted for a harmless homer by Earl Torgeson. The A's climbed on Steve Gromek for five singles and their four runs in the fifth.
Rookie Wins Game
Rookie Wes Covington, battling for winning pitcher Bob Buhl, cracked a run-scoring single to break a 1-all tie and send Milwaukee into a 2-0 record.
Frank Thomas singled home the deciding run in the eighth for the Pirates after Preston Ward's pinch single off Al Worthington scored two for a 2-1 Buc lead in the seventh.
The Brooks scored twice in the 10th to win for reliever Clem Labine as Rube Walker lifted a sacrifice fly in a pinch role with the bases loaded against reliever Duane Pillette. Roy Campanella had tied it with a double — to become the sixth current Dodger with 1,000 major league hits.
For all the homers it was a baser-loaded single by Wally Post off reliever Ellis Kinder — who fanned Wally to save Tuesday's opener — that got the job done for the Redlegs. Ray Jablonski grand-slamed to get the Reds back in the game in the seventh. Ted Kluszewski (his first), Post and Smokey Burgess also homered for the Reds. Stan Musial, Wally Moon and Bill Sarni, who got two, whacked 'em for the Cards.

Landy May Run In Oregon AAU

PORTLAND (AP) — Australia's John Landy, one of two men to run the mile in under four minutes, may compete in the Oregon AAU track and field championships here June 2.
Frank Learned, chairman of the Oregon meet, said Thursday AAU officials here are trying to make arrangements through the national AAU to bring Landy here to race against two Oregon milers, Bill Dellinger and Jim Bailey.
Landy, who holds the world mile record at 3 minutes, 58 seconds, will race in the Southern California Relays at Los Angeles May 5 and the West Coast Relays at Fresno May 12.

Alabama Athletes Get Own Way, End Walkout

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (AP) — Nearly 100 University of Alabama athletes have moved back into the school's athletic dormitory after officials agreed to their demands for less stringent regulations.
After a meeting Thursday with athletic director Henry G. Crisp, the athletes issued a statement which said the "whole athletic situation... has been united through our sessions the last few days."
The athletes quit the athletic dormitory Tuesday night. They said they would not return until their demands for easier rules were met.
The players called the incident a "misunderstanding." They quit the dormitory after footballer Roy Vickery of Atlanta, Ga., was placed on probation. He had checked in late following a car wreck early Sunday.
