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Riddle District Voters To Pass On Budget Figures

Riddle school district voters on rural school district election day May 11 will vote on \$231,722 outside the 6 per cent limitation for elementary purposes and \$73,231 for high school purposes.

The voting for the rural school levy election will be from 2 to 8 p.m. at the high school, reports correspondent Erma Best.

The announcement of the election was made this week at a school board meeting.

The meeting was shorter than expected because of the postponement of the final inspection of the elementary building addition. It had been planned to hold the inspection but a special floor tile to complete the basketball court was not delivered and work was held up. A new date will be set for the inspection.

Also discussed at the meeting was a probable date for opening bids on the remodeling of the high school. It was set for May 21 at 8 p.m. Bid forms will be released this weekend following study by the board.

In other activity by the board, it heard a report from William Strohbridge, Citizens' Committee chairman, on the committee's work. He said a written report would be presented to the board before the May 21 hearing. He also reported on changes necessary in fire insurance coverage.

The board also:

1. Discussed development of the athletic field at the high school and the elementary playground and parking areas.
2. Heard that three directors plan to attend the May 3 meeting of the Douglas County School Boards Assn. in Reedsport.
3. Went on record in favor of establishing an attendance or juvenile officer in cooperation with other communities in the area.
4. Granted permission to Hal Schultz, chairman of the Chumquas' talent show, to hold a dance in the school gymnasium May 4.
5. Received a tentative school schedule for the 1956-57 school year from Supt. Kenneth Stuart.
6. Set the next board meeting May 14 at 8 p.m.

A shiny new bookmobile should arrive in Roseburg early in May. It will provide service to areas without a branch of the Douglas County Library.

It has been built at the Mair & Son plant in Union Gap, Wash. Bookmobile Librarian Charlotte Hyre returned from the plant this week. She said delivery of the mobile library was being held up a bit to finish necessary painting and lettering.

The bookmobile will have a deep red and cream exterior. The interior is being completed in a light blue green surf color.

During May the bookmobile will be on display throughout the county. Miss Hyre hopes to start service around June 1, when she sets up a regular run for the county. The bookmobile will load about 2,100 to 2,150 books. It includes a magazine rack and a place for records when that service is started sometime in the future.

One-Act Play Contest To Take Place Tonight

SPRINGFIELD (AP) — A body tentatively identified as that of Orville Fandrem, about 50, Springfield, was found in the ruins of a fire-damaged house here Thursday.

Coroner Fred Buell said a check was under way to determine positive identification. A neighbor, Mrs. Ellen Rogers, discovered the blaze. She said she tried to get inside the flaming house, but heat and smoke kept her out. Mrs. Rogers said Fandrem was a part-time gardener.

Salk Polio Vaccine Shortage Expected To Be Over Soon

Although at the present time Roseburg has an apparent shortage of Salk polio vaccine, the time may be near when local doctors will have enough for all who wish vaccinations.

A. G. McLain, secretary of the Oregon State Pharmaceutical Assn., said that members of the vaccine allocation committee for Oregon, appointed by the State Board of Health, told him this week that the Eli Lilly Co., major producers of date of the Salk vaccine, will have its biggest release for Oregon about June 1.

McLain said that this should alleviate the local shortage. Several doctors have reported that they have long lists of persons waiting for the vaccine to be made available for use.

Meanwhile, Douglas County Health Officer Dr. E. J. Waincott reports that the health office has Salk vaccine available for those eligible for county help. He said that under present regulations vaccinations will be restricted to those who can't afford to go to a private physician for the shots.

Dr. Waincott stated that anyone in need of the vaccine, especially those with large families, are welcome to contact him at the county office in the courthouse for further information.
