

Glendale Rebirth Observed Today

Twenty-seven years ago today, May 1, 1929, a gala celebration heralded the rebirth of the Southern Douglas town of Glendale. Residents gaily turned out for the dedication of the A. A. Snyder Lumber Co. (now the Robert Dollar Lumber Co.) and the new business district. Less than a year earlier, July 11, 1928, 19 of the town's 27 business houses had burned.

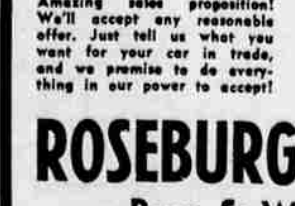
