Supreme Court Decisions Issued On Four Appeals

WASHINGTON, May 1 — In actions Monday the Supreme Court:

1. Decided 5-3 that U.S. attorneys in beginning denaturalization proceedings must furnish to federal judges affidavits showing there is "good cause" for such actions. The dissenters said the ruling "seriously obstructs the government in filing denaturalization proceedings."

2. Held 6-3 that evidence obtained by federal agents who listen in on illegal radio broadcasts may be used before grand juries and in trials.

3. Upheld 8-0 the right of employers to bar from company parking lots union organizers who wish to distribute union literature.

4. Denied former Rep. O. K. Armstrong (R-Mo.), free lance writer for magazines, a review of his conviction on income tax charges. Armstrong was fined \$1,500 in U.S. District Court in Springfield, Mo. The case stemmed from a \$2,500 check received from the Reader's Digest in 1949. Armstrong served one term in the House from 1951 to 1953.

The large residence being removed was built by the late Elmer L. Bashford, grandfather of Robert Bashford, manager of Douglas County Flour Mill.

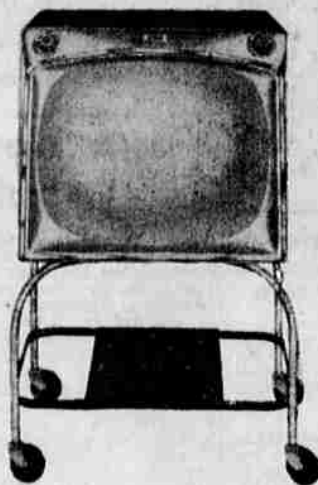
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
