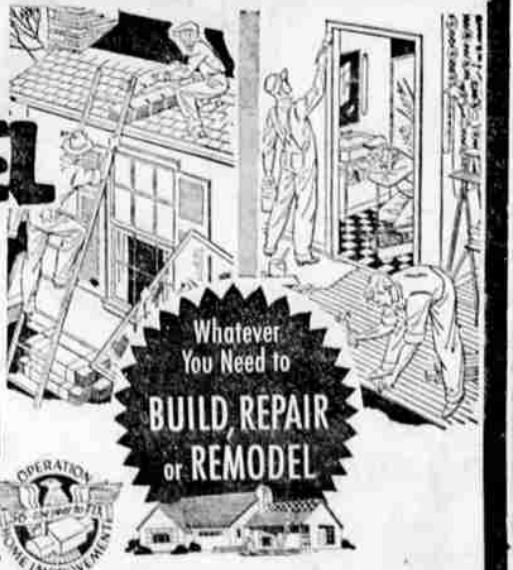

Other permits include three of \$1,000 each for additions or alterations of dwellings, one of \$300 for a garage and woodshed, and \$50 for building a chimney.

**State Welfare Budget Is Set At \$34,411,473**

PORTLAND (AP) — The state Public Welfare Commission here has approved an annual budget for 1956-57 of \$34,411,473.

Funds budgeted for medical care and old age assistance were higher than in the 1955-56 budget. There was a slight decrease in general assistance funds.

The 1955-56 budget was \$32,572,903, but administrator Loa Howard Mason said additions were made during the year.

The budget included these selections: \$2,807,362 general assistance; \$699,564 general assistance medical care; \$1,124,427 foster care; \$14,970,256 old age assistance medical care; \$5,846,679 aid to dependent children; \$262,456 aid to dependent children medical care; \$342,102 aid to blind; \$31,362 aid to blind medical care; \$3,112,725 aid to permanently disabled; \$370,089 aid to permanently disabled medical care.
