Remote Nepal Crowns King

KATMANDU, Nepal — Remote Himalayan Nepal crowned its new King today in a ceremony mixing ancient pomp with such modern innovations as movie cameras, foreign visitors and only one queen.

Hindu high priests placed the giant crown of the little kingdom — a gem-studded circlet of gold surmounted by brilliant bird of paradise plumage — on the head of 36-year-old King Mahendra at 10:43 a.m.

It was the precise minute fixed by the royal astrologers as most auspicious for a long and successful reign of the world's only Hindu monarch, ruler of nine million Nepalese.

Whirling motion picture cameras and hundreds of clicking shutters recorded the coronation in the palace courtyard. Official delegates from a score of countries and a handful of tourists looked on from distant reserved seats.

Behind a red curtain other guests "looked on." They were the unseen Hindu gods invited to the ceremony.

Lumber Standards Committee Keeps Mum On Decision

CHICAGO — The American Lumber Standards Committee kept secret Tuesday its decision on whether to approve three-quarter-inch boards for construction.

J. H. Carr, Washington, D. C., secretary of the committee, said the group reached agreement at a meeting here Monday, but decided to withhold the announcement until the Department of Commerce could review the matter.

The department will get the reaction of the industry and lumber users before approving or disapproving the ALS recommendation, Carr said.

He said the Commerce Department will make the announcement when ready.

The board standard has been 25-32d of an inch, but recently West Coast mills have been producing — and stamping — boards three-quarters of an inch thick.

The Federal Housing Administration, which follows ALS standards, said it would allow these boards to be used in the interim, but might refuse to accept them if the ALS does not change the standard.
