Foundation Started For Church Edifice

Work began recently on the pouring of concrete for the foundation for a new 40 x 70 foot church edifice for the congregation of the Glendale Southern Baptist Church. The new building, which will be erected of concrete blocks, will be situated on First Street opposite the Glendale Elementary School and adjacent to the present building which is to be moved back and used for classroom space when the new sanctuary is completed. The new building, which will have a seating capacity of 350 or more, will include choir space on the platform behind the pulpit and a baptistry behind that. On either side of the platform there will be a 10 x 15 foot room. At the front of the building, in addition to the entrance hall, there will be a 10 x 20 foot nursery room, a 10 x 10 foot office, and rest rooms.

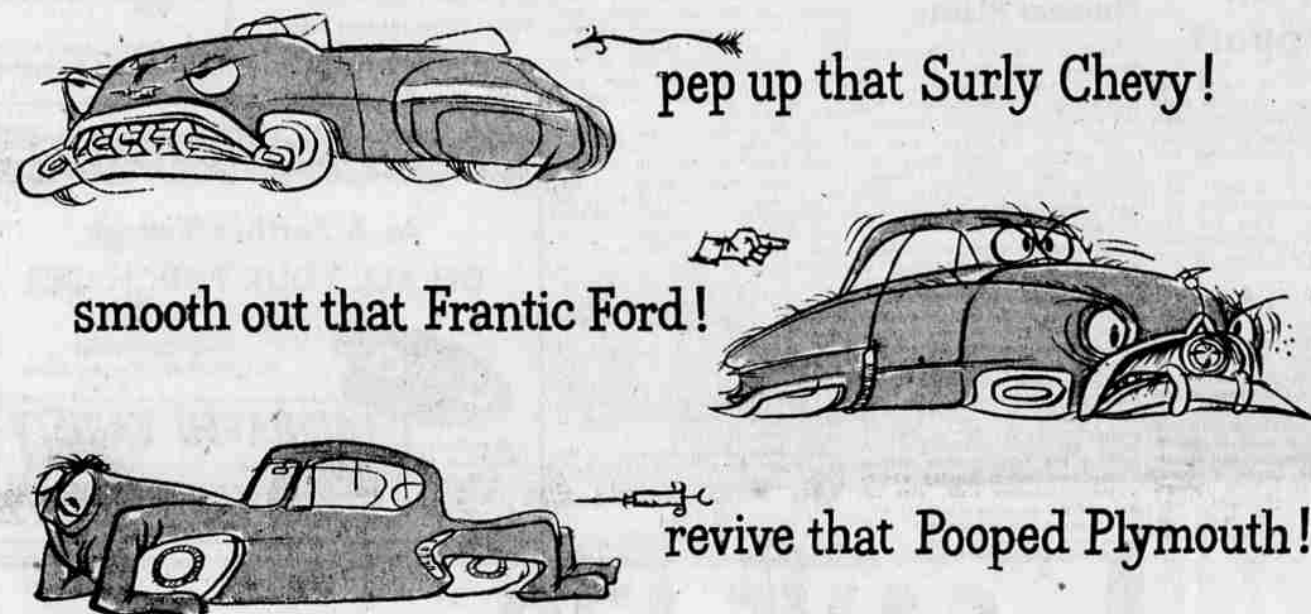

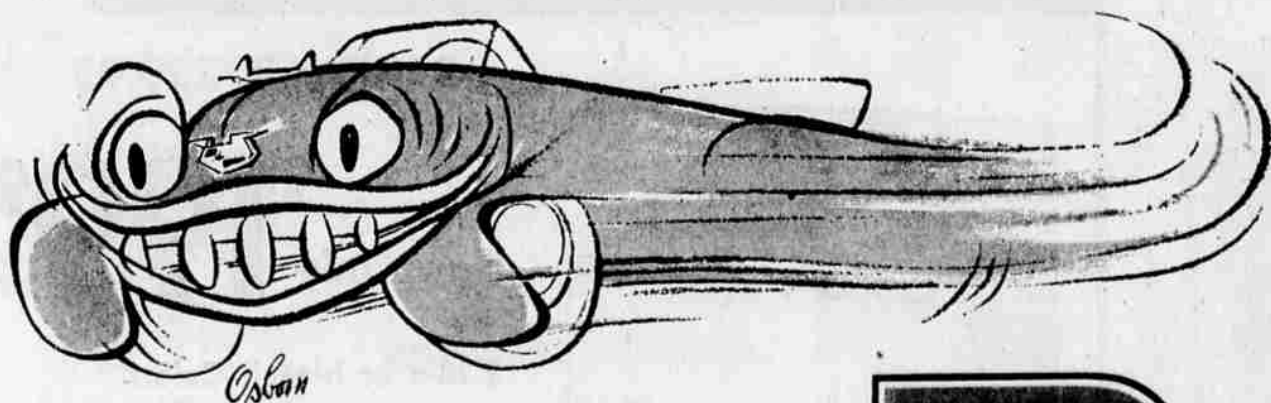


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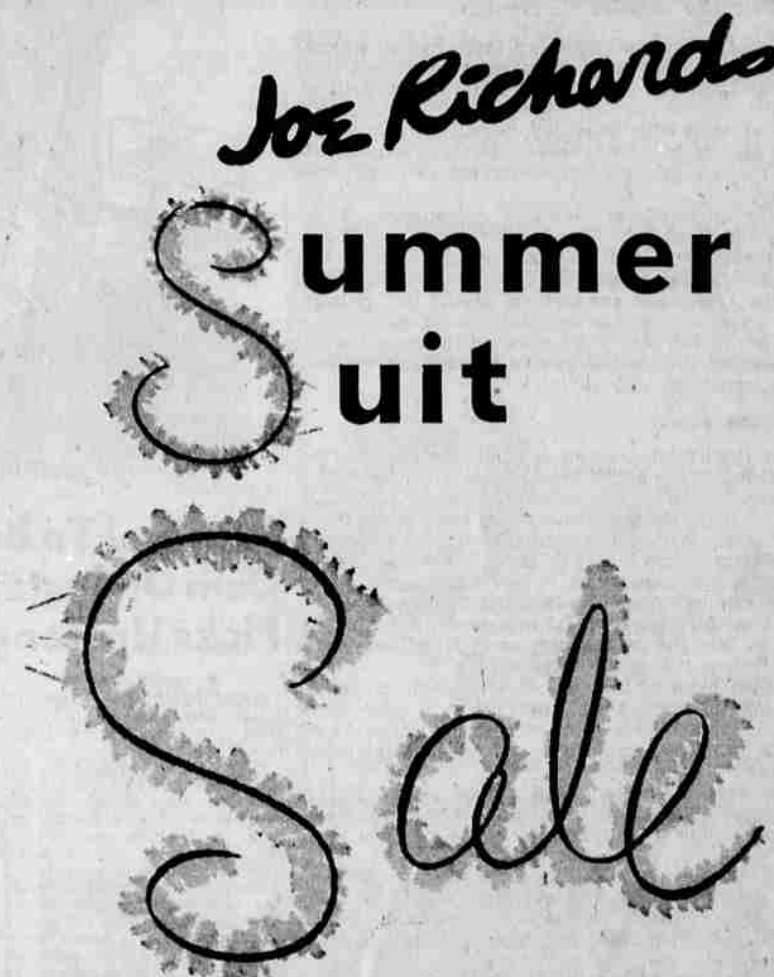
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
