Actor William Holden To Crash Sound Barrier

HOLLYWOOD — Actor William Holden says he will crash the sound barrier Saturday in a TF86 Sabre Jet.

Holden will be the first actor to do it, his studio claims.

The flight will be made at Edwards Air Force Base, Edwards, Calif., where Holden recently filmed "Toward the Unknown," a movie about the faster-than-sound jet pilots.

The star, whose love for high speed and danger made him soup up his foreign car so that it will go 200 m.p.h., already has gone through the necessary indoctrination course and passed the physical tests, the studio said yesterday.

The jet will be piloted by a friend, Brig. Gen. J. S. Holtomer, commanding general at Edwards.

Grand Jurors To Hear Evidence On Billy Nunn

MEDFORD — A grand jury will begin hearing evidence Friday morning against Billy Junior Nunn, 28, Klamath Falls, accused of killing a 14-year-old boy last month.
