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Body Of Missing Son Severe Blow On Mother's Day

CHICAGO — A young mother's hope of seeing her missing son return on Mother's Day went unfulfilled. His body was found in the Chicago River.

"We were hoping that because today was Mother's Day he would come home to us," sobbed Mrs. Leo Rausch, 32, on learning of the death of her son Leo Rausch Jr., 8.

"Last Mother's Day he saved money from his allowance and bought me a beautiful flower," she recalled.

Police said the boy's body had been in the water at least a week and possibly since the day of his disappearance April 30 when he failed to show up for school. They said he apparently had drowned. His body bore no marks of violence.

Mrs. Rausch said her son had run away several times last winter but returned home each time on his own.

The Rauschs have four other children, ranging in age from 3 to 9.

Supreme Court Must Be 'Curbed,' Ex-Member Says

WASHINGTON — James F. Byrnes, a former associate justice of the Supreme Court, said today the court "must be curbed."

"Power intoxicates men," Byrnes said in a copyrighted article in the magazine U. S. News & World Report. "It is never voluntarily surrendered. It must be taken from them. The Supreme Court must be curbed."

Byrnes, a member of the high court in 1941-42, also is a former member of the Senate and of the House and holder of various high offices in the Franklin D. Roosevelt and Truman administrations, including the secretaryship of state in the latter. His most recent public office was as governor of South Carolina.

Byrnes assailed as a "usurpation of power" the Supreme Court's decision outlawing racial segregation in the public schools and hinted that the decision may not have been unanimous, as was announced at the time it was handed down two years ago this week.

Noting that the court continued from one year's term until the next the five cases which were

consolidated for purposes of the decision, Byrnes wrote that "had the court been unanimous such an opinion would have been written within a few months," and he continued:

"Instead, after many months, the court announced that the cases should be reargued and counsel should direct their arguments to certain questions."

Declaring that "we can only speculate as to how the court reached its decision," Byrnes said the framers of the Constitution and members of Congress who approved the 14th Amendment contemplated school segregation. The court relied on the 14th Amendment in its antisegregation decision.

Byrnes said the only relevant change in conditions since the adoption of the 14th Amendment "was that several million Negroes

had migrated to the big cities in Northern states and constituted the balance of political power in several states."

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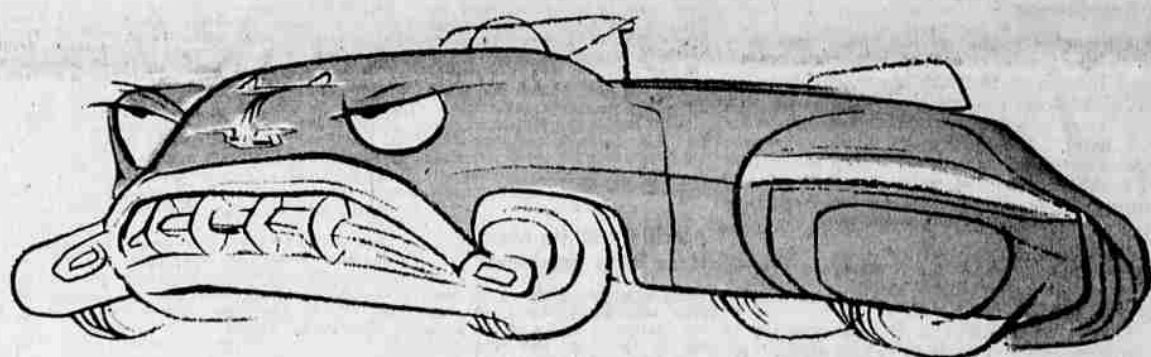
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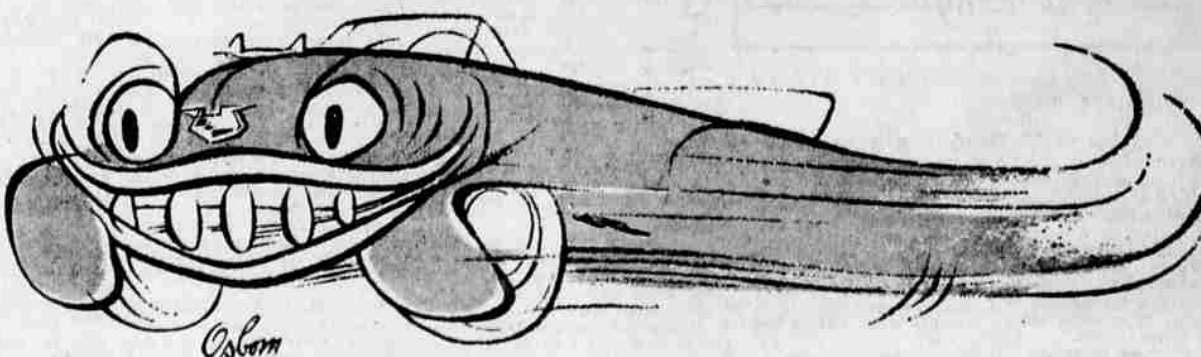
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
