



Winning Frog Fails To Equal World Record

ANGELS CAMP, Calif. (AP)—Buck Jr., a croaker from a bayshore slough at Oakland, Calif., leaped 15 feet 9 inches to win the International Frog Olympics Sunday. Buck Jr. outjumped foreign and domestic competition without benefit of the surreptitious buckshot which stopped Mark Twain's "celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County" in 1853. The winning frog was owned and trained by Bill Basacker, an eighth-grade student from Oakland. The world record, established in 1954 by a local frog named Lucky, is 16 feet 10 inches in the standard three-hop jump.

Klamath and Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Mathes of Ashland; and great-grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Homer Bennett of Hillsboro.

The body has been removed to Long & Orr Mortuary, and will be taken to Medford for services at Conger-Morris Mortuary Wednesday at 1 p.m., with the Rev. Newell Morgan of the First Christian Church of Roseburg officiating. Concluding services and interment will follow in the Mem-

ory Gardens. In lieu of flowers, friends may make donations to a memorial fund for the boy. They may be sent to First Christian Church or Long & Orr Mortuary.

Southern Pacific Excursion Train Gets Riddle Salute

Several hundred Riddle residents turned out Saturday afternoon to see a rare sight—a Southern Pacific passenger train. The train, carrying about 125 people on a California-Nevada Railroad Historical Society tour, stopped in various Douglas County cities. Sunday, it headed back to San Francisco from Eugene by way of SP's main line.

The demonstration at Riddle sponsored by the chamber of commerce, included a salute from the Riddle High School band, reports correspondent Mrs. Erma Best. Over 100 Riddle people left the train to Myrtle Creek as guests of SP.

The excursion director was very enthusiastic over the Cow Creek Canyon scenery, Mrs. Best said. A couple from New Hampshire came west especially to make the trip through northern California and southern Oregon. Southern Pacific officials took many pictures, and nickel ore samples were taken so they could be sent to the president of the railroad.

Riddle was the only town on the north-bound trip which put on a special observance for the train, which arrived about 4 p.m. Ashland, Medford, Grants Pass and Roseburg were among the stops

on the Siskiyou line, which formerly was SP's main line. Passenger service on the line was discontinued last summer. Since that time, there have been attempts to have SP restore service. Hearings on the matter were held recently at Roseburg and Medford.

West Coast Airlines Seeks Nonstop Permit SEATTLE (AP)—West Coast Airlines is seeking a permit for two-way nonstop service between North Bend-Coos Bay and Portland. The line reported Saturday it has applied to the Civil Aeronautics Board.

The airline said the Coos Bay area is topped only by Portland and Seattle as an originating point for its passenger traffic.
