Deadline Set For Vets Mortgage Cancellation

Oregon state veterans' home and farm loan borrowers whose loans

were closed before March 1 have only until May 31 to apply for mortgage cancellation life insurance without having to prove insurability.

This warning was issued today by H. C. Saalfeld, director of the state Department of Veterans' Affairs, which administers the Oregon home and farm loan program for World War II and Korean veterans.

The mortgage insurance program, which took effect March 1, is designed to pay off the mortgage on the home of a loan borrower in event of his death. Veterans with existing loans were given until May 31 to take the insurance without evidence of insurability. About 1,160 veterans have still failed to apply, Saalfeld said. Veterans whose loans were closed after March 1 are automatically insured unless they refuse the insurance.

The insurance costs 28 cents per month for each \$1000 of insurance, on the unpaid balance of the loan. The insurance does not increase the veteran's monthly repayments. Instead, it is paid off by the addition of a few more months on the end of his repayment period. Mortgages have already been paid off on the homes of five veterans who died since the insurance program took effect March 1. The insuring firm is Standard Insurance company of Portland.

Wallace Finds He Didn't Have Heart Trouble

PORTLAND (AP)—Former State Sen. Lew Wallace, Portland Democrat who withdrew from the governor race a month ago because he thought he had heart trouble, thinks he would have won his party's nomination if he had stayed in.

He wouldn't say what he would do if there were a late reversal and he went ahead in the counting. In spite of his withdrawal, he was in a close race with State Sen. Robert D. Holmes, Gearhart. In 1,803 of 2,519 precincts, Holmes' lead was only 49,681 to 46,226. After he announced his withdrawal, Wallace said, he found out he didn't have heart trouble.

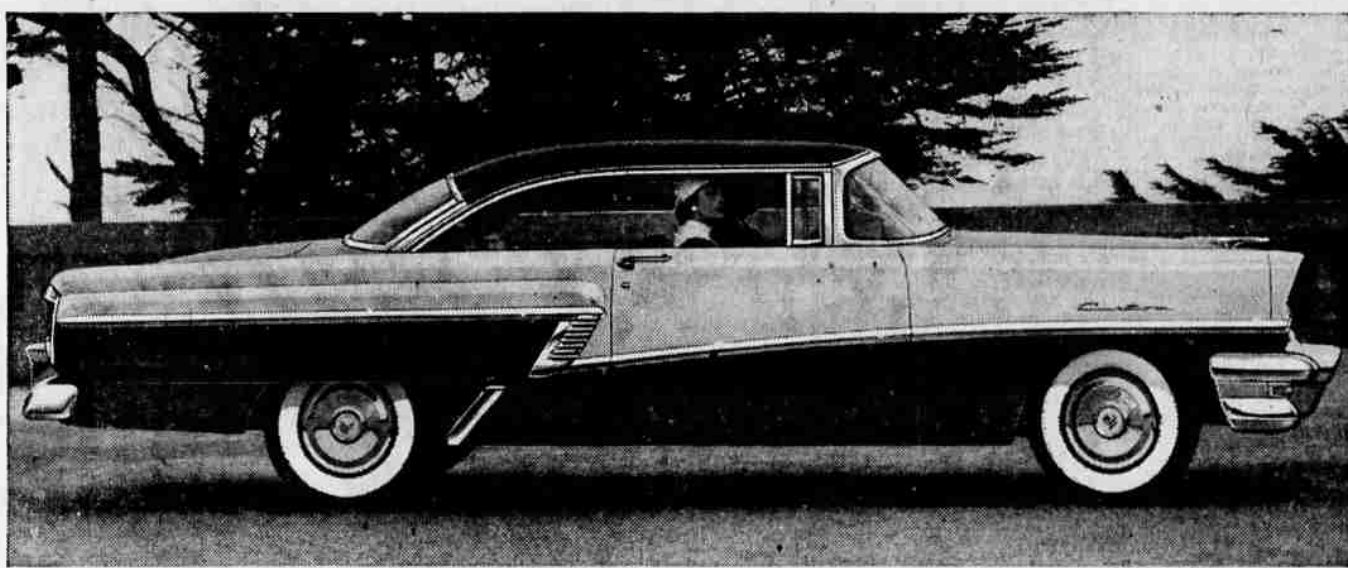
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
