Air Route Runs Into Opposition

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Four gateway Pacific Coast cities, in urging a federal examiner to open the polar route between the West Coast and Europe, have encountered opposition from two air lines serving the Pacific Northwest.

The hearing before Civil Aeronautics Board Examiner William J. Madden here will go on all week.

United Air Lines and Northwest Airlines Tuesday opposed part of Pan American World Airways' petition to fly both the polar route and a route across the United States to Europe from the West Coast. Pan American isn't certified as a domestic carrier.

Observers said United and Northwest fear that Pan Am would cut into their domestic business.

UAL attorney John Lorch said his firm also will oppose making Seattle and Portland part of the polar route. He said he doubts there is enough traffic to make it worth flying to Europe from these cities.

The hearing is on the petition of Pan American and of Transworld Airlines to fly from Los Angeles, San Francisco, Portland and Seattle to New York and London across the polar cap, cutting 5 hours off existing routes.

This would be the first use of the polar route by an American air service. The Scandinavian Airlines System has a monopoly on the polar run with 20 flights a month.

Corvallis Okays Bonds For New Fire Station

CORVALLIS (AP) — Corvallis voters have approved a \$100,000 bond issue to help finance a new fire station.

This will allow the city to sell the present station to Roberts Bros. as part of the site needed for a new department store. The firm already has bought the adjoining old city hall and plans a \$800,000 store.

The new fire station will be built outside the main downtown district. The bond approval for it was 1,335 to 247.

BLM Timber Sales Total 39 Billion Feet In April

PORTLAND (AP) — Timber sales on lands supervised by the Portland office of the Bureau of Land Management totaled more than 39 billion board feet in April, James F. Doyle, Portland area administrator, said Tuesday.

The April sales brought totals for the first 10 months of the current fiscal year to 491 million board feet valued at nearly 18½ million dollars.

Most of the sales have been on O & C and Coos Bay Vason Road lands administered by the Oregon office of BLM.

The bureau said sales of wind-blown and insect-damaged salvage timber accounted for 154 million board feet of the O & C totals in the fiscal year to date.

This timber brought more than 6 million dollars. Principal sales of salvage timber have been in the Eugene and Coos Bay marketing areas.

Soviet Medical Men Agree Smoking Is Bad

LONDON (AP) — A Soviet medical man agreed Wednesday with those Western researchers who believe smoking may lead to lung cancer.

The Russian added that cancer of the stomach may be caused by addiction to hot soup.

A Moscow Radio broadcast carrying the views of the medical spokesman identified him as Prof. Larionov, an associate member of the U.S.S.R. Academy of Medical Sciences.

Log Prices Unaffected By Weak Plywood Sales

CORVALLIS (AP) — A weak tone in the market for sheathing grade plywood and green Douglas fir lumber has not yet affected log prices, Oregon State College said Wednesday in its weekly forest products report.

Long No. 2 Douglas fir sawlogs were quoted at mostly \$35 a thousand in Willamette Valley mills. Peeler logs were quoted on top at \$35, \$36 and \$37 a thousand in various parts of the valley.

Harry Gain Family Prepares To Ride Storm In Dispute

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Harry P. Cain family is "battering down the hatches" financially—in the words of Mrs. Cain—to ride out the storm over the dispute between her husband and the Eisenhower administration.

Cain, former Republican senator from Washington and member of the Subversive Activities Control Board, climaxed a long series of attacks on the administration's security program last Thursday with the sharpest worded speech he has made on the subject. He broadly indicated he did not expect reappointment to his job when his term expires in August.

Tuesday Mrs. Cain confirmed that the family is getting ready with these moves:

They have rented out their expensive home here and moved into a small apartment.

Mrs. Cain, an experienced interior decorator and theatrical designer, has taken a job with a decorating shop and obtained a license to sell real estate.

She will go to Tacoma next month to sell property there owned in the West Coast city.

Cain has centered his criticism of the security program on what he describes as injustice to individual federal employees, suspended and jobless while they wait out long delays in final judgment on security charges.

Mrs. Cain echoed that idea in an interview.

"Talk about the Truman deep freeze," she said. "There's a New England freeze around Eisenhower."

*Sherman Adams (chief White

House Aid) says this is just a quarrel between Harry and the attorney general. That isn't so. This is a deep and fundamental issue, of vital importance to the country, and I'm sure the President would realize it if Harry could just get him to listen."

She said she sees no inconsistency between her husband's conservative record as a senator and his present championship of accused government employees.

She called him "a true conservative, which in the finest sense is a true liberal." He would "always be the one who would catch a pendulum that had swung too far to the left or the right," she said.

Eisenhower Says Tax Cut Shouldn't Be Made Now

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower said Wednesday the government should by no means think of cutting taxes at this time despite an expected \$1,800,000,000 budget surplus.

Eisenhower told a news conference tax cutting should be deferred until a start has been made on reducing the nation's enormous national debt.

There is such a thing as fiscal integrity, he said crisply.

Eisenhower said the \$1,800,000,000 surplus recently estimated by the Treasury was only an estimate and could be far off, depending on the rate of revenue collections.

So, he said, the estimate would be a very poor excuse for cutting taxes at this time.

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Duke's Bodyguard Has Been Tripled

LONDON (AP) — Security officials were reported Wednesday to have tripled the Duke of Edinburgh's bodyguard after widespread rumors that Cypriot terrorists have slipped into Britain to try to kill Queen Elizabeth's Greek-born husband.

The Home Office and Scotland Yard declined to discuss the reports of increased security precautions for Britain's royal family—and for members of Prime Minister Eden's government—but an informed source said:

"The Duke's guard is three times as large today as it was before and other precautions have been taken concerning the safety of other persons in the United Kingdom."

The terrorists were rumored to be plotting to assassinate the Duke in revenge for the hanging by the British of two Greek Cypriots last week.

Greek-speaking Cypriots, who want their Mediterranean island united with Greece, are staging a campaign of violence against the British who govern the island.

The Duke of Edinburgh was Prince Philip of Greece before his marriage. Some Cypriot extremists now consider him a traitor to Greece.

Iraq Parliament OKs Wide Development Plan

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — The Iraqi Parliament approved the second phase of the national development plan on which the government is to spend the equivalent of \$1,400,000,000.

Funds for the program, called "an additional six-year development plan," are derived from Iraq's oil revenues.

The program includes construction of dams, irrigation systems, housing, schools and industries. The first five-year phase of the program was completed this year.

TAKE OVER INSURANCE

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — The lower house of India's Parliament Wednesday approved legislation to create a government corporation which will take over all life insurance in this country. The bill still must be approved by the upper house.

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
